## Pledge

To **pledge** is to promise. And at the heart of the sacrament of Marriage are promises made and promises kept. Notice, however, that there is something very special about the pledging or promising that belongs to marriage. Usually, promises are about doing something or keeping something. In marriage, it is different. A man and a woman pledge and promise *themselves*. It couldn't be more personal. They give not something but themselves to each other.

Now we know how fragile our human pledges and promises can be. In the sacrament of Marriage, when a couple pledges themselves to each other, they wrap that promise in faith in God who will sustain the union and keep them faithful. Human pledges and promises are full of risks and unknowns. What makes them real and possible is a love that is more than human. It is God's sustaining love.

# **Transforming Our Lives**

The common theme of the Second Sunday of Lent is transformation. The readings invite us to cooperate with the grace of God with the assistance of the Holy Spirit to transform our lives by renewing them during Lent and to radiate the grace of the transfigured Lord around us by our Spirit-filled lives.

The transfiguration of Jesus in today's Gospel reveals his glory which He had before His incarnation and the glory which He will obtain after His resurrection. Jesus wanted to show His disciples His glory so that they may have a foretaste of what He is and how He will be after undergoing suffering, death and resurrection. He wanted to show them His glory so that they may know in advance that His suffering and death will lead to His glorification. And if the disciples decide to follow Him in the way He is undertaking, they will also share His glory.

We too, like the disciples are invited to share Jesus' glory, but we cannot share His glory unless we are willing to share His cross. We have to suffer and die with Him and then rise with Him. We die with Him when we transform our lives from sinfulness to holiness. There are three transformations in our journey towards heavenly glory: The first change begins at Baptism which washes away our sins, transforming us into children of God and heirs of heaven. The second transformation takes place through our victory over the trials and tribulations of life. Every challenge, every difficulty, every moment of suffering, is an opportunity for transformation and spiritual growth. The third transformation takes place at death. Eternal life in heaven, perhaps after a period of further transformation in purgatory, is granted to those who have been found worthy. The last transformation or transfiguration will be completed at the Second Coming when our glorified body is reunited with our soul.

All of us in one way or another need transformation in our Christian lives so that our actions may reflect Christ's image; seek reconciliation instead of revenge, love our enemies, pray for those who hate us, give to the needy without expecting a reward, refuse to judge others and make friends with those we don't naturally like, to hold back on harsh words and let love rule, pray for those who give us a hard time, avoid bad-mouthing those we don't agree with and forgive those who hurt us. Only a transformed Christian in the likeness of Christ is able to put into practice these virtues.
