Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed

Second Sunday of Easter - April 12, 2015



#### "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed"

Thomas said to the other apostles who have seen the risen Christ, "Unless I see, unless I touch, I will not believe" Thomas wanted to see and touch Jesus so that he may believe that Jesus was alive. This sounds to be very reasonable and logical especially in the rationalistic approach. The prevailing opinion in the modern world is that everything can be rationally explained. With high technology we have in the modern world, if something is obscure, all we have to do is shed a ray of scientific light on it and it will become clear.

While it is true that reason and scientific approach to reality is important in the material world, it is not applicable to the realm of faith. We cannot proof what we believe scientifically. To adopt Thomas's approach would be to condemn ourselves to living in a purely material world. Not all reality can be seen or touched. There is layer of reality which eludes our senses but which, nevertheless, is absolutely real. The visible and tangible world is only part of a greater world which includes invisible and intangible realities from which it draws its chief significance. Faith belongs to the invisible and intangible world. Faith takes us where our senses cannot go. If we are able to see and touch, then we don't need to believe, because the very nature of faith is to believe what is beyond our senses. This is why to those who don't believe in God, faith does not make sense. God cannot be perceived by our senses.

The same applies to the risen Christ. We cannot see and touch him with our senses, but we can experience his presence in our lives if we believe. If we want to see and touch him physically so that we may believe, then that is not valuable faith, and there is no blessedness on that kind of faith. By asking Thomas that he had come to believe because he had seen him, Jesus was disapproving that kind of faith. This is why he said, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed" If we believe we are among the blessed ones because we believe and we have not seen him.

The reality of the resurrection of Christ cannot be perceived by our senses but can be experienced and felt in our hearts. It is not felt by the touch of the hand but by the touch of Christ's love. And it can be felt in a community of believers who love and care for one another.


