## Fond Hope.

The sign itself was as pathetic appearing as the person lying behind it. Scribbled in what looked like red lipstick, it was barely legible: "Poems for Pennies." The man behind the sign seemed like he'd tossed himself down in a heap. His legs and arms akimbo, he could not have looked less like someone ready and able to make poetry on the spot.

For just a moment as I passed him I was tempted to search my pockets for loose change to throw into the Twins baseball cap he'd upended to collect his poetry pay. I wanted to know if he really would deliver the rhyming verses his plea promised. I realized it was an anomalous pleasure--my sudden fascination with the potential of this street person to offer a bit of variety and entertainment in my day. I have been less intrigued by the signs of other homeless people which read, "God bless you for anything you can spare for me."

A student who was about to graduate from UWEC once asked me before he left, "Do you have any advice for me?" That question is rare among graduating students. I said, "Not so much advice as a hope, a hope that you will be able to better care for the side-lined and marginalized and the not-so-good people than I have. The hard part is caring about and for the people who seem not to deserve it."

I always hope there are better people than I am around. I understand from the little moments in my life like

passing the penniless poet that I have a higher opinion of myself than my actions would warrant. I don't think I'm alone on that score but I want to believe there are truly virtuous and holy, well-intentioned and well-acted people out there who do what a worthy disciple of Jesus would do.

I guess I know saints exist–great ones like Mother Theresa and St. Francis but I want to know there are everyday saints who would have given the penniless poet a buck and passed on the poetry. I want to know there are everyday saints who pick up blowing bits of trash and throw them in a garbage can, who hear a nasty rumor about someone and refuse to pass it on, who look at me when I am being less than noble and pray for me rather than judge me. Don't we all want more of those people in this world? Maybe by Easter there will be at least a few more right here in Prescott. That's my hope anyway...GRS





Even though I will not be here to administer these plans, I am responsible for planning them. 
