

YEAR OF Matthew



November 23rd, 2014 34th Sunday ~ Christ the King

Celebrating Christ the King, we acknowledge Christ's rule over our lives. For biblical Israel, our image for God was king; another image, found in Ezekiel, is that of shepherd. In Ezekiel the role of shepherd and king are related. God will 'look after and tend my sheep' (v12). As shepherd, God says, 'The lost I will seek out,' and the strayed I will bring back,' the injured I will bind up,' the sick I will heal' (v16). The Lord promises to 'appoint one shepherd over them to pasture them, my servant David' (see v23). The promise is fully realized in Jesus, Son of David.

Paul speaks of the primacy of Christ, the 'firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep' (v 20). In his resurrection, Jesus comes to reign over everything, and this reign will last 'until he has put all his enemies under his feet' (v 25). When this happens, Christ 'will also be subjected / to the one who subjected everything to him' (v 28). By acknowledging Christ's sovereignty, we also acknowledge the sovereignty of the one who sent him.

The text of Matthew today presents the image of Jesus 'in his glory' (v 31), judging the nations on this throne. Like the shepherd in Ezekiel, he will separate 'the sheep from the goats' (v 32). This is an image of judgment, reminding us that we are accountable to God for our lives. As Christ's flock, we depend on him, but we are also called to love him and to acknowledge his presence in our neighbor by meeting their basic needs in hunger, thirst, and illness. Jesus tells us that we cannot love him if we do not love our neighbor. Let us once again renew our pledge to serve Christ the king by living true lives of discipleship.

For reflection: Why is it sometimes difficult to love 'the least ones'? How can I better express my loyalty to Christ the king?
