YEAR OF MARK

December 7th, 2014 Second Sunday of Advent

Today we hear from the prophet known as Second Isaiah. Beginning in chapter 40 the tone of the book changes, as does the perspective. A book that formerly presented words of judgment and doom to the people of Judah and Jerusalem now turns to prophecies of "comfort" (v1), addressing the exiled people in Babylon. The Prophet announces that their "guilt is expiated" (v2) and calls them to "prepare the way of the Lord" (v3), who comes to deliver them and bring them home to Jerusalem. "Here is your God!" (v9), the prophet cries out.

In Second Peter we are encouraged to live in anticipation of the Lord's return, conducting ourselves "in holiness and devotion" (v11). God desires "that all should come to repentance" (v9), and so what seems like a delay is an opportunity for us to reform our lives, a message echoed by the prophets of the Old Testament and John the Baptist.

For Mark, the ministry of John the Baptist is a fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy of "a voice of one crying out in the desert" (v3). Today's Gospel is unusual in that while it anticipates Jesus' presence, he is not yet present. We hear from the precursor, John, who is presented in imagery echoing the prophets of biblical Israel: "clothed in camel's hair,...[feeding] on locusts and wild honey" 9v6). John calls to us to "prepare the way of the Lord" (v3). Joan Chittister, in her book The Liturgical Year, reminds us that "it is while waiting for the coming of the reign of God...that we come to realize that its coming depends on us" (62). As we wait, let us prepare by transforming our lives with the power of God's love, that we may welcome him when he comes.

For reflection: What can I do to help prepare the way of the Lord? Has there been a time in my life when I experienced God's patience with me before I repented? How can this insight help me in my relationship with others?

ADDRESS OF POPE FRANCIS TO THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT STRASBOURG 25 NOVEMBER 2014

How, then, can hope in the future be restored, so that, beginning with the younger generation, there can be a rediscovery of that confidence needed to pursue the great ideal of a united and peaceful Europe, a Europe which is creative and resourceful, respectful of rights and conscious of its duties?

To answer this question, allow me to use an image. One of the most celebrated frescoes of Raphael is found in the Vatican and depicts the so-called "School of Athens". Plato and Aristotle are in the centre. Plato's finger is pointed upward, to the world of ideas, to the sky, to heaven as we might say. Aristotle holds his hand out before him, towards the viewer, towards the world, concrete reality. This strikes me as a very apt image of Europe and her history, made up of the constant interplay between heaven and earth, where the sky suggests that openness to the transcendent – to God – which has always distinguished the peoples of Europe, while the earth represents Europe's practical and concrete ability to confront situations and problems.

The future of Europe depends on the recovery of the vital connection between these two elements. A Europe which is no longer open to the transcendent dimension of life is a Europe which risks slowly losing its own soul and that "humanistic spirit" which it still loves and defends.
