Lent

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

THE LAMB OF GOD

"Behold the Lamb of God!" We hear this phrase every Sunday at Mass, but there's a good chance that many Roman Catholics do not know who in the Bible originally spoke it. The phrase appears only in the Gospel of John, on the lips of John the Baptist, who utters it twice. In today's Gospel reading, John proclaims Jesus as the Lamb of God, and two of John's own disciples then follow Christ. A little bit later Andrew, who heard John and then followed Jesus, brings his brother Simon to be re-named Cephas, or Peter. A careful look at these Bible verses shows us the mission of everyone baptized into the Body of Christ: we must always proclaim our faith in Christ, so that others will follow him. We may not know how the will of God might work through those we bring to Christ; that is not the point. The point is that our ongoing mission as a church is to bring others to Christ, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.

The Word of God This Week

'Here Am I, Lord'

John and two of his followers saw Jesus. John said, "Here is the Lamb of God!" The two men started following Jesus, who asked them, "What do you want?" They asked where he lived. Jesus said, "Come and see!"

One of the men was Andrew. After a while, Andrew went to find his brother, Simon. He told him, "We have found the Messiah!" When Jesus saw Andrew and Simon coming, he said, "Simon, you will be called Peter."



Come to nocturnal adoration here at St. Therese on the first Tuesday of each month!

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament follows the 8:30 AM Mass, continuing throughout the day and night until 8:15 AM on Wednesday, with Benediction just before the 8:30 AM Mass. Dates of the first Tuesdays are:

January 2, February 6, March 6, April 3, May 1, June 5, July 3, Aug 7, Sept 4, October 2, Nov 6, December 4.

You can sign up on a month by month basis so if you are not here for a particular month choose another.

If you are wondering what you are supposed to be doing during the hour of sitting before the Blessed Sacrament – DON'T WORRY! There are no 'have to 's but here are some suggestions.

If you are tired, just sit. What parent wouldn't like to hear their child say, "I'm too tired to talk right now – can I just rest with you?"

If you are burdened, happy, frustrated – share it. What parent wouldn't love to hear what's on their child's heart?

Then let Him speak to you in the silence. Clear your mind and listen.

There will be books, articles, and prayer cards for inspiration.

Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy – because it is like an extension of the sacrifice of the Mass wherein we offer to the Father the very Body and Blood of Jesus.

The one thing you MUST do is to be '<u>real'</u> with Jesus. Build a relationship by honest communication. Adore Him: begin and end by thanking and praising Him for who He is. There is a sign-up sheet in the Narthex. Please write down the hour that you wish to spend in adoration along with your name, phone number and email address.

Celebrate Religious Freedom Day - January 16, 2018

National Religious Freedom Day is observed on January 16 every year since 1993 to commemorate the Virginia General Assembly's adoption of Thomas Jefferson's landmark Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom on January 16, 1786. This vital document became the basis for the Constitution's First Amendment establishment clause, and led to the protection of freedom of religion for all Americans. Every president writes an official Proclamation on this day.

Why We Need Religious Freedom:

FOR

RELIGION

"Religion and good morals are the only solid foundation of public liberty and happiness," said Founding Father, Samuel Adams in 1778.

An academic report from Princeton University argues that vigorously advancing religious freedom is in America's national interests:

- The basis for religious freedom is awareness of the reality and dignity of the human person. Since religion is a human impulse to know and relate to something bigger than one's self and is a phenomenon found in all times and cultures, to interfere with living out religious experience, is to interfere with human fulfillment.
- "When citizens are free to have an ultimate commitment to something more than human. something beyond the authorities of state and society, the power of the state is thereby limited."
- At the same time, religious freedom disciplines religious people to treat their noncoreligionists with respect.
- Morally, religion is just not religion unless it is done freelv.
- Legally, democracies have recognized that far from being a marginal special interest religious freedom is a central human right. (nationalcatholicregister.com, 2012; mormonnewsroom.org, 2/3/12; Dr. D. Dreisbach, 2/16/15)

Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program

The Diocese of Rockville Centre announced that the deadline to file for Phase I of the Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program (IRCP) for survivors of sexual abuse by clergy of the Diocese of Rockville Centre has been extended to January 31, 2018. The first phase of the IRCP was originally scheduled to end on December 31, 2017. Any person wishing to file a new claim alleging sexual abuse not previously reported to the diocese may be eligible to participate in Phase II of the program when it is implemented in early 2018. These reports will be turned over to the local District Attorney and investigated fully prior to a determination by the IRCP.
