My Dear Family of St. Therese,

Last week we heard the first words of Jesus in John's Gospel to Andrew and John, "What are you looking for?" We were invited to reflect on what we are looking for in living our faith. How does our faith help and support us in our day to day lives.

Today we hear Jesus' first words in the Gospel of Mark, "Come after me." Last week it was about what we are looking for, this week we find out what or who Jesus is looking for – YOU and ME!

In our first reading we find that the Lord does not always call us where we may want to go. In fact, we know that Jonah fled when the Lord first called him. Today's reading is when he surrenders to the Lord's call. In our Gospel we find that the Lord does not always call us when it is at our convenience. He calls the apostles while they are working. The Lord's call comes at unexpected times. If we believe that He calls, we will be attentive and find what we are looking for – living our faith. And when we answer that call, we will be like Andrew in last week's Gospel and bring others to experience the Lord.

January is a quiet month for most of us, but as we take down our Christmas Decorations let us not forget that while the decorations may be put away, the gift of Christmas lingers on in our hearts and hopefully in our homes. The lights may go into storage, but may the Light of Christ, the true Christmas gift, illumine our hearts and our lives.

THE DEMANDS OF DISCIPLESHIP

Today we encounter readings that already have a Lenten feel about them. Nineveh undergoes a forty-day fast, the psalmist reminds us that God alone can show sinners the way, Paul shows us how fleeting the things and events of this world are, and Jesus cries out "Repent!" before he calls his new followers. "Come after me," Jesus says, but if we are to truly live out the commands and demands of our discipleship through baptism, we must first know our need for conversion, our repentance, our need to believe in the gospel fully. Today's Gospel opens with the stark reminder of what befell John the Baptist for completely living out his vocation as the herald of Christ and the gospel: he was arrested, imprisoned, and martyred. Though few of us will experience consequences that extreme, we must all be ready to risk some sort of rejection as, heeding the call of Jesus, we live out the kingdom of God at hand, repent of our sins, and believe in the good news of salvation. 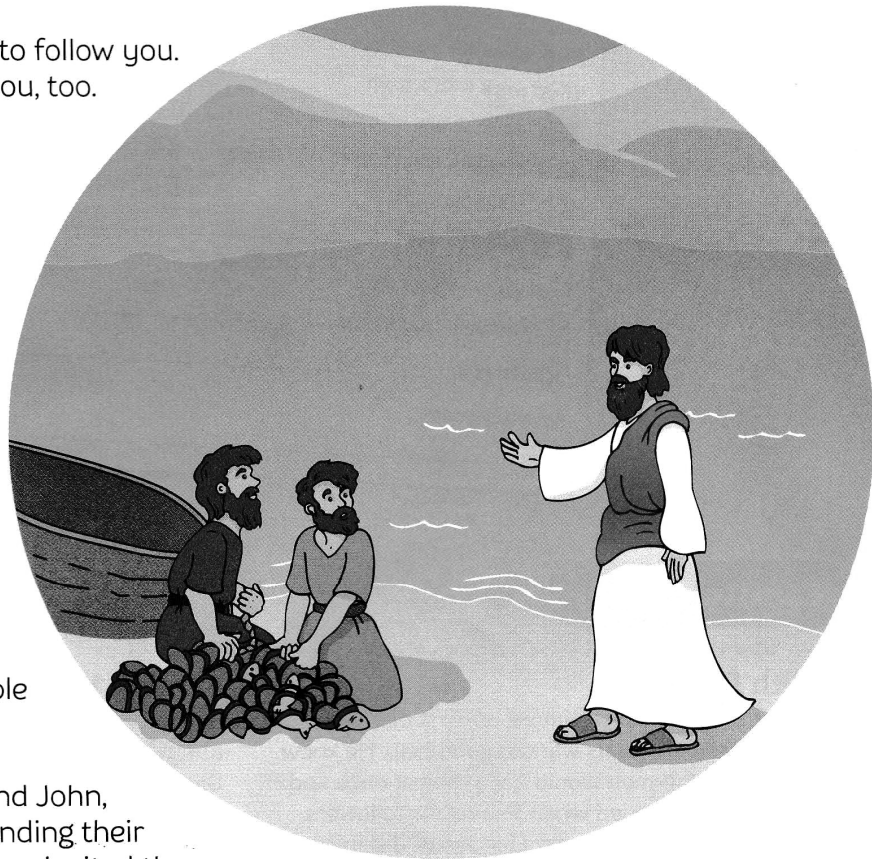


The Word of God This Week

Come to nocturnal adoration here at St. Therese on the first Tuesday of each month!

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament follows the 8:30 AM Mass, continuing throughout the day and night until 8:15 AM on Wednesday, with Benediction just before the 8:30 AM Mass. Dates of the first Tuesdays are:

January 2, February 6, March 6, April 3, May 1, June 5, July 3, Aug 7, Sept 4, October 2, Nov 6, December 4.

You can sign up on a month by month basis so if you are not here for a particular month choose another.

If you are wondering what you are supposed to be doing during the hour of sitting before the Blessed Sacrament – DON'T WORRY! There are no 'have to's but here are some suggestions.

If you are tired, just sit. *What parent wouldn't like to hear their child say, "I'm too tired to talk right now – can I just rest with you?"*

If you are burdened, happy, frustrated – share it. *What parent wouldn't love to hear what's on their child's heart?*

Then let Him speak to you in the silence. Clear your mind and listen.

There will be books, articles, and prayer cards for inspiration.

Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy – because it is a unification with the sacrifice of the Mass wherein we offer to the Father the very Body and Blood of Jesus.

The one thing you **MUST** do is to be 'real' with Jesus. Build a relationship by honest communication. Adore Him: begin and end by thanking and praising Him for who He is.

What's new from the Desk of the Religious Education office...

Do you ever struggle in your search for answers to justify the pain and suffering we are witness to in the world, or perhaps, closer to home? Do you ever question God's presence?

As one of a larger group of adults who completed the DRVC School of Missionary Disciples program in 2012, (then called Pastoral Formation Institute), I highly recommend it. It is a commitment yes...however, for me personally, it truly helped me to begin the process of learning to really trust in God. The experience helped me to develop an understanding which allowed me to accept, that as human beings we don't have the knowledge or insight to understand why certain things happen; why the world works the way it does and not the way we think it ought to work! Only God knows. But, as we grow in our relationship with God, we can at least begin to accept the mystery of God and the mystery of life and trust in Him that everything will be OK. It may not always have the end result that we might choose or hope and pray for, but we can be sure that it will be the end result that is best for us. Have faith!

School of Missionary Disciples is a two year program with its primary focus on both spiritual growth and theological study. The first year is about self-knowledge; understanding God and oneself more deeply. Emphasis is placed on personal spiritual growth and faith formation and on how this process of growth can only be enhanced with the understanding of Scripture. Therefore, study of both the Old and the New Testaments is an important aspect of this year's curriculum. There are also many opportunities for meditative listening and theological reflection, both of which encourage the development of a deeper and more meaningful prayer experience for all.

The second year is about the relationship between self and others with its focus on how we interact with each other; how we live the Christian life as members of the Church community. This year's curriculum places emphasis on understanding more fully, the Sacraments and Liturgy and on how a greater understanding of our Catholic Tradition allows for the development of a more personal relationship with God.

For myself and many others, SMD was not only a wonderful learning experience and an opportunity to meet some wonderful people, it was also a time of spiritual growth and an experience that served as a reminder that even with all the ups and downs life brings, God is always present!

Catholics for Freedom of Religion

Why Religious Freedom Matters:

As a New Year begins, America finds itself at a tipping point, with the stakes for religious freedom at an all-time high. Many cases are working their way through the courts while some will be heard by the U.S. Supreme Court. These cases involve prayer, military religious rights, faith-based business owners, and houses of worship. Unfortunately, many cases don't even make it to the court system since citizens will often capitulate to intimidation out of ignorance of their First Amendment protections, fear of job or societal repercussions, or legal costs (though many law firms defend religious freedom pro-bono.)

Examples of Student Religious Expression on trial:

At two different Long Island, NY, public schools students were made to turn their t-shirts inside out to hide the Bible verses on the shirts.

A Florida agency banned two Christian schools from using a stadium speaker system to pray before a championship game, even though this was common practice.

These 2 cases are each one step below the Supreme Court.

Examples of Military Religious Rights on trial:

A 33-year Air Force veteran, Oscar Rodriguez, was forcibly removed from a private retirement ceremony at a CA airbase because he planned to say the word "God" in his speech.

Two high-ranking military officers, Col. Bohannon and Col. Madrid, are being punished for their religious views on marriage.

Examples of Business Owners on trial:

An OR family-owned bakery is being fined \$135,000 for declining - on religious grounds - to create a custom cake for a same-sex wedding. The government says it also wants to "rehabilitate" their religious views.

MN film makers, Angel & Carl Larsen, are facing large fines or 90 days in jail for declining to video a same-sex wedding.

Examples of Houses of Worship on trial:

A synagogue in Dallas, TX, is fighting for its existence against zoning regulations.

An Orthodox Jewish community in Los Angeles, CA, was sued by animal rights activists trying to prevent a millennium-old religious ceremony (kosher chicken) from taking place in various synagogues. (CFFR, Students of Faith lessons, 2017; firstliberty.org, 12/28/17; ncregister.com, 6/22/12; thf_media, s3,amazonnews)

Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program

The Diocese of Rockville Centre announced that the deadline to file for Phase I of the Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program (IRCP) for survivors of sexual abuse by clergy of the Diocese of Rockville Centre has been extended to January 31, 2018. The first phase of the IRCP was originally scheduled to end on December 31, 2017. Any person wishing to file a new claim alleging sexual abuse not previously reported to the diocese may be eligible to participate in Phase II of the program when it is implemented in early 2018. These reports will be turned over to the local District Attorney and investigated fully prior to a determination by the IRCP.
