My Dear Family of St. Therese,
HAPPY LENT!

YES! Lent can be a happy time when we realize the reasons why we sacrifice, why we pray more and why we give to the poor. We do it for our relationship with Jesus. As you can see the crucified Christ is above the altar to remind us of His great love for us. As He said, "There is no greater love than to lay down your life for your friends." And that is true. It is the greatest sign of human love. The Resurrected Christ shows us the greatest sign of Divine love – eternal life.

Lent is a time of journey, but we do not journey alone. Hopefully we will travel with Jesus. Relationships grow through time spent together and it is the same with our relationship with Jesus. Be it times of prayer, times of willful sacrifice or times of service – with Christ, our relationship will grow. At Easter, like Jesus we will rise to a new life and hopefully stronger relationship that we had with Him at the beginning of our Lenten journey.

Speaking of journeys, our Pilgrims leave for the Holy Land this afternoon. Monday we will land in Tel Aviv and head for Jerusalem. We will travel the Way of the Cross, visit the Church of the Holy Sepulcher (which enshrines Calvary the site where Jesus was stripped, nailed to the cross and died for us), the site where Jesus was placed in Mary's arms and the Empty Tomb. At the foot of Calvary there is the site where Mary stood, supporting her son and beyond the Empty Tomb is the shrine of Mary Madeline, where Jesus appeared to her on that first Easter morn. We will sail the Sea of Galilee, float in the Dead Sea and visit Nazareth. I always tell people that once you visit the Holy Land, you will never read the Bible the same way – you'll see it in your mind.

Abstinence and Fasting

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.

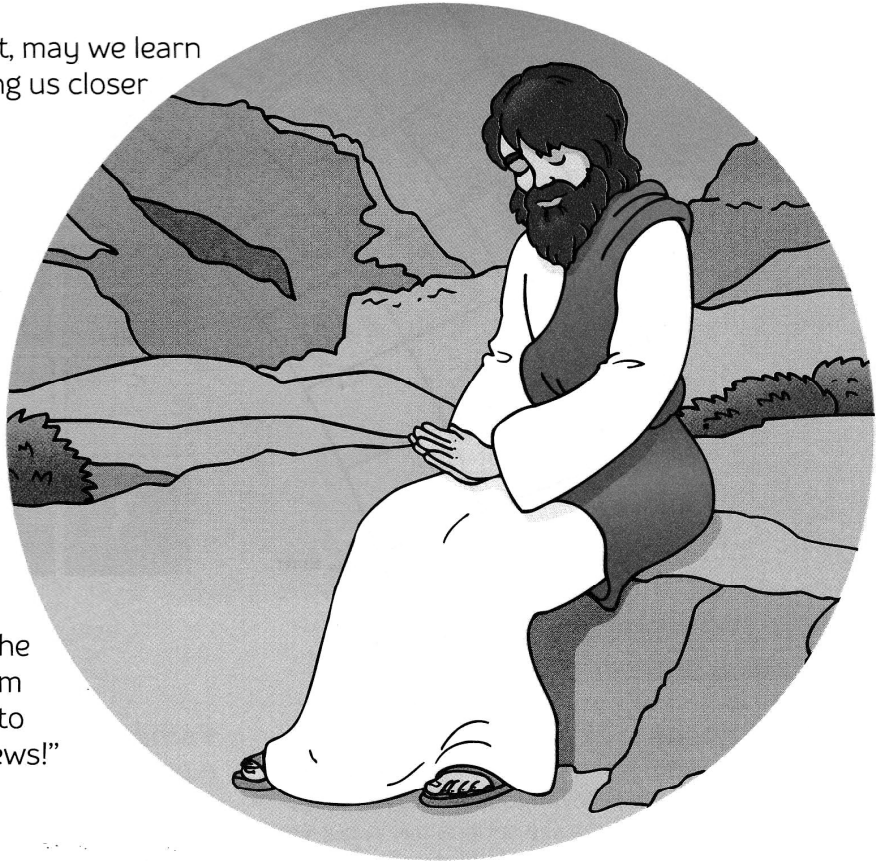


The Word of God This Week

Come to nocturnal adoration here at St. Therese on the first Tuesday of each month!

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament follows the 8:30 AM Mass, continuing throughout the day and night until 8:15 AM on Wednesday, with Benediction just before the 8:30 AM Mass. Dates of the first Tuesdays are:

January 2, February 6, March 6, April 3, May 1, June 5, July 3, Aug 7, Sept 4, October 2, Nov 6, December 4.

You can sign up on a month by month basis so if you are not here for a particular month choose another.

If you are wondering what you are supposed to be doing during the hour of sitting before the Blessed Sacrament – DON'T WORRY! There are no 'have to's but here are some suggestions.

If you are tired, just sit. *What parent wouldn't like to hear their child say, "I'm too tired to talk right now – can I just rest with you?"*

If you are burdened, happy, frustrated – share it. *What parent wouldn't love to hear what's on their child's heart?*

Then let Him speak to you in the silence. Clear your mind and listen.

There will be books, articles, and prayer cards for inspiration.

Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy – because it is a unification with the sacrifice of the Mass wherein we offer to the Father the very Body and Blood of Jesus.

The one thing you MUST do is to be 'real' with Jesus. Build a relationship by honest communication. Adore Him: begin and end by thanking and praising Him for who He is.

Lectio Divina is an ancient Catholic prayer form of praying with the bible that encourages meditating and contemplating....So the idea is to read, reflect and then contemplate on how the readings relate to you in your everyday life experiences.

DOCTRIN'E

During the first two weeks of Ordinary time, Father Tom's Sunday sermons focused on the the first words of Jesus to the people who were to follow Him. In John's gospel (1/14) Jesus asks: **What are you looking for?** and then says: **Come follow me.** On the following Sunday in Mark's gospel, Jesus tells the followers: **I will make you fishers of men.** As the life of Jesus unfolds in the "rest of the story," He presents the simplest message: **Love God and love you're neighbor as yourself.**

All of us here at Saint Therese have been part of the story in a variety of ways as eucharistic ministers, choir members, lectors, volunteers, CCD instructors, ushers, servers, food pantry contributors, food preparers for parties, dancers for parish functions, gardeners, and outreach folk The names of the latter appear on the opposite page. You may or may not be able to read them, but God knows who they are! During the past ten years they have manned the phone and done all that the outreach program has asked. (See the items listed below.) So many of them have commented how much they have gotten out of their experience of "doin'" — especially on the rides they have shared with those in need of a lift.

We need to update this list of names. Several have grown up or moved away or gone to heaven. Perhaps your name is not there and you would like to be part of this group. You may never be called on, but your good will will be a source of blessing for you and us as well!

So what are you doin'?

Could you be available to give someone a ride to church or do a local errand such as shopping or picking up a prescription?

Could you be an occasional visitor to a shut-in, bring song or hymn (as some have done!)

Could you on occasion drive someone to Southampton for tests or to visit a loved one?

Could you on occasion supply a bit of relief to a care giver?

Could you on occasion be an emergency baby sitter?

Would you like to work the Outreach Hotline? It only takes one day a month and can be done from the comfort of your home!

Would you be able to assist in some small home repairs (lamps, stuck doors, leaking faucets, etc.)?

Would you be able to assist the elderly or the infirm with a garden chore?

Love - Life - Liberty: Part 2

Conscience and Religious Freedom Protections Restored at HHS:

The Dept. of Health and Human Services announced on Jan. 18 that it has formed a new *Conscience and Religious Freedom Division* that would "restore federal enforcement of our nation's laws that protect the fundamental and unalienable rights of conscience and religious freedom." Its purpose is to protect the conscience rights of healthcare workers and hospitals that decline to perform certain procedures such as abortions, euthanasia, or sex-change surgery. "The conscience of Catholic health care does not allow us to participate in certain procedures we feel are an assault on the dignity of human life," said the Catholic Health Association.

"The Founding Fathers knew that a nation that respects conscience rights is more diverse and more free," said acting HHS Secretary, Eric Hargan.

Social Media Blocks *Roe vs Wade* Movie Funding:

Facebook blocked the crowdfunding site of a pro-life movie about the *Roe vs Wade* Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion across the U.S. "Facebook has pulled down our ads, the paid ads and any mention of the unpaid ads," said Dr. Alveda King, executive producer and niece of Martin Luther King Jr. "They have even blocked people sharing the ads I paid for," said Nick Loeb, actor/producer. "Many documentaries have been made, but no one has had the courage to make an actual feature film, a theatrical movie about the true story."

Facebook later said they would restore the ads for *Roe v Wade*, the movie.
