While the calendar says Spring, the weather says something different. But we know within our hearts that the Risen Lord has brought hope and new life!

Our Holy Week celebrations were wonderful. Our bi-lingual Holy Thursday and Easter Vigil Masses were very prayerful and had a nice attendance. Our Good Friday services were also wonderful, from Mary's Stations at noon to our 3:00 Veneration of the Cross. Our Spanish community gave us a powerful presentation of the Stations of the Cross at 6:00 followed by Veneration of the Cross and Communion.

I do have to say that I was disappointed that on Holy Thursday after Mass everyone left. The one night that Jesus asked His disciples to stay for one hour with Him, I was the only one in the church, and this is the second year it has happened.

I have been asked for more exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and I find the church empty when I visit. Even those who have asked are nowhere to be found and I end up making phone calls to remind those who signed up for specific times. I am told, "I'm too tired", or "I forgot!". It seems to me that this was a great idea and thought in the beginning, but our leaders are becoming tired of their commitment.

We will continue our Nocturnal Adoration for the month of May, but if the response continues to be indifferent, out of respect for the Blessed Sacrament we will just continue the adoration on Tuesdays after the 8:30 Mass with a Holy Hour and Benediction at 10:00 a.m.

Second Sunday of Easter (or Sunday of Divine Mercy)

SO THAT YOU MAY BELIEVE

It is not often that the author of one of the books of the Bible comes right out and tells us directly why he is writing what he is writing. In this Sunday's Gospel reading, taken from the conclusion of John's Gospel, the author tells us that he has chosen to record these events so "that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name" (20:31).

The letter of John echoes this idea by saying that "[e]veryone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God" (5:1)—what we might refer to as being "born again." Our reading from the Acts of the Apostles for this Second Sunday of Easter shows us exactly what it looks like when believers are born again through faith.

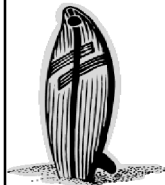

Come to nocturnal adoration here at St. Therese on the first Tuesday of each month!

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament follows the 8:30 AM Mass, continuing throughout the day and night until 8:15 AM on Wednesday, with Benediction just before the 8:30 AM Mass. Dates of the first Tuesdays are:

January 2, February 6, March 6, April 3, May 1, June 5, July 3, Aug 7, Sept 4, October 2, Nov 6, December 4.

You can sign up on a month by month basis so if you are not here for a particular month choose another.

If you are wondering what you are supposed to be doing during the hour of sitting before the Blessed Sacrament – DON'T WORRY! There are no 'have to's but here are some suggestions.

If you are tired, just sit. *What parent wouldn't like to hear their child say, "I'm too tired to talk right now – can I just rest with you?"*

If you are burdened, happy, frustrated – share it. *What parent wouldn't love to hear what's on their child's heart?*

Then let Him speak to you in the silence. Clear your mind and listen.

There will be books, articles, and prayer cards for inspiration.

Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy – because it is a unification with the sacrifice of the Mass wherein we offer to the Father the very Body and Blood of Jesus.

The one thing you MUST do is to be 'real' with Jesus. Build a relationship by honest communication. Adore Him: begin and end by thanking and praising Him for who He is.

Catholics for Freedom of Religion

"ANY AND ALL CHRISTIAN MUSIC IS BANNED! "

Florida: This sign was posted on an organ located in a commons area of a condo building in Port Charlotte, FL. The condo Board passed a new resolution in February that stated, "prayers and other religious services, observations, or meetings of any nature shall not occur ... in or upon any of the common elements." A group of residents had held a Bible study group in the buildings common room for almost a year.

"The (condo) resolution, both in text and in application, is discriminatory and violates the Fair Housing Act because it prohibits ... residents from accessing common condominium areas for any religious activity, while allowing other residents to use those same facilities for similar secular purposes," said First Liberty law firm, after a resident filed a federal complaint.

Freedom of Speech and Religious Expression under attack:

~Michigan: Citizens at a Senior Center were told that if they continued to say Grace before meals, federal funding for the meals would end. "If you continue to pray, you know what will happen." The message was clear - you can either eat or you can pray.

The Great Lakes Justice Center has challenged this policy.

~Pennsylvania: In 2016, when the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) revised regulations regarding food distribution to the homeless to say that no religious activities - such as praying over the meal - could occur, Bethesda Mission was forced to decline accepting USDA surplus food. "... in some way, we serve 100,000 poor and homeless people a month ...," said the Mission. "We don't force our faith on anybody. But we find the whole idea of the government coming in and tell us what to do .. is out of bounds, especially in matters of faith"
