My Dear Family of St. Therese, Bon Jour!

It's time to brush up on your French. We are in the process of planning our next pilgrimage. Our last one to the Holy Land was quiet a success. The pilgrims are still talking about the pilgrimage and how Holy Week was an entirely different experience this year since they could see the sights in their minds as we read the passion. We were on the Mount of Olives, at Caiaphas' house, at the foot of Calvary and in the empty tomb.

Our next pilgrimage will begin on April 22, 2019 (the day after Easter) and return May 3rd. We will be going to France and visit Lourdes, Lisieux, Tours, Mt. San Michel, Paris and many other sights in the French country side. It will be a 12 day pilgrimage. While we do not have the price, a flyer is in the lobby of the pilgrimage itinerary. In our first reading today in the Garden of Eden we hear the effects of sin in our lives. Sin destroys relationships. When challenged by God about eating of the forbidden fruit, Adam first blames God for creating Eve and then he blames Eve for giving him the fruit. Eve in turn blames the serpent. Neither Adam nor Eve takes responsibility for their actions. How often we can be like Adam and Eve. When we make mistakes, do we own up to them or do we find some else to blame? When we are honest with ourselves, we become like Adam – naked before our God and Father.

<u>Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time</u> <u>PROMISES</u>



Religious Persecution Worldwide - 2 Types:

In North America and Europe we see a "Polite Persecution" through intimidation and legislation. **In Asia and Africa** we see more and more "Violent Persecution."

1. Polite Persecution: in Michigan, Fired for her

Faith: A Catholic clinical social worker with 20 years experience providing individual psychological counseling to a diverse group of patients, was fired because she declined marriage counseling to a same-sex couple since her faith teaches marriage is between one man and one woman. Her supervisor said she had to be "a social worker first and a Catholic second."

"This case shows that people of faith are under assault in the workplace," said a Thomas More Law Center attorney. "... discrimination against Christians is a civil rights violation that will subject employers to legal liability."

2. Violent Persecution: Radicalized Hindus have increased violent attacks on the religious minorities of Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, and Buddhists. These range from arson of churches to priests beaten & killed, nuns raped, and the destruction of Christian schools, colleges, and cemeteries.

Ten pastors and co-workers were taking 60 children to a Christian summer camp last May when they were surrounded by police, put in prison, and charged with kidnapping, cruelty, and forceful conversion. Although the parents protested saying they wanted their children in the camp, the pastors remained imprisoned.
