BACK TO "THE WEARIN OF THE GREEN!"

And you don't have to be Irish. We are back into Ordinary Time in our Liturgical Church year and Green Vestments will be worn from now until Advent at Sunday Masses. The color green is the color of hope. It represents the springtime when the earth returns to life after winter.

The term "Ordinary Time" means that we are not focusing on a special event in the life of Jesus and the Church (Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter). We focus on the three years of Jesus ministry and His day to day life. For us it is a time that we focus on the everyday life and how Jesus reveals Himself to us in ordinary ways. How we experience His presence in our family and friends, and sometimes in strangers. A simple act of kindness that we receive or give that shows our dedication to living the Christians Life. Hopefully we will be more aware of His love in the summer weeks ahead.

I have been asked at weekday Mass about different priests that we pray for each day. When someone has heard the name of a priest they know they question if he is alright. The answer is that he is quite alright and that the Diocese has asked us to pray for our priests each day (and those studying for the priesthood.). There is a schedule on the Church Bulletin Board in the lobby of the church of which day is given to what priest and Seminarian. Each month we get a new listing.

Sunday, June 25th we will have our Pre-Summer **Parish Council** meeting at 12:00 in the parish center – all are invited to attend. We will have an update of past activities and a look into future ones.

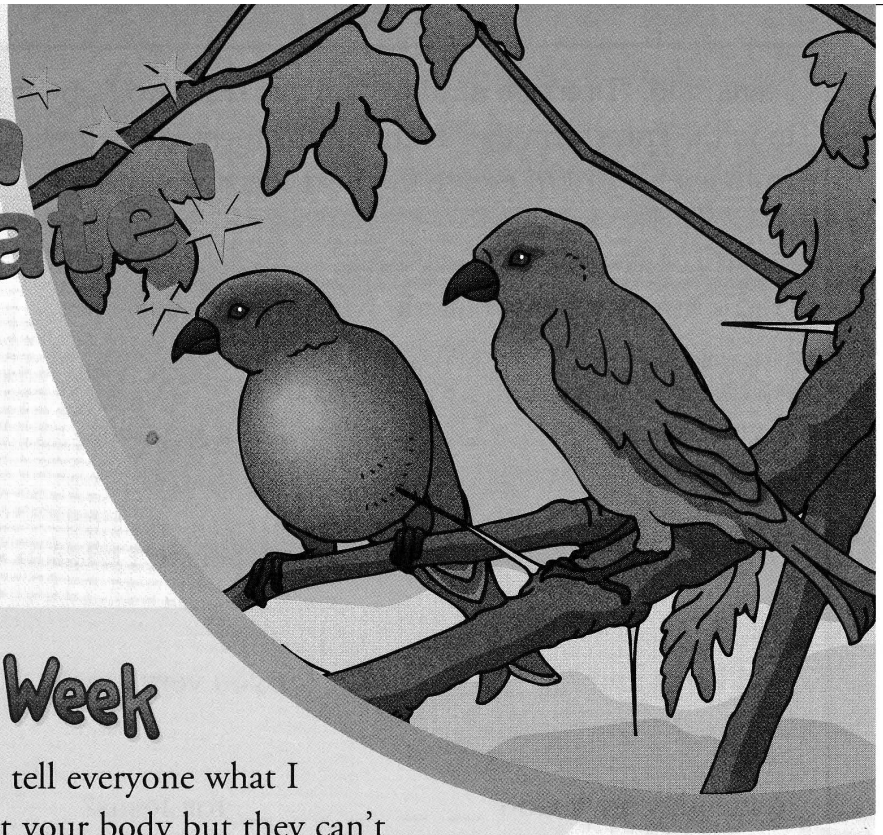

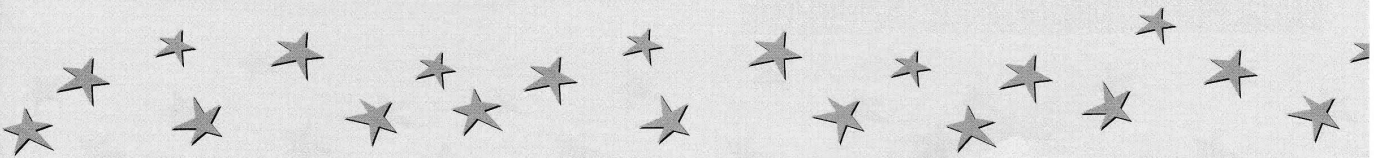
