We start our tour in Lourdes, the second most popular tourist city in France. What Does "Religious Freedom" Really Mean?
- Freedom of Religion is a fundamental human right and the first among rights guaranteed by the U.S. Constitution. It protects the conscience of all people and is the right to think, express and act upon what we deeply believe.

Freedom of Religion as a political principle, strives to forbid government restrictions on peoples' choices or beliefs. It requires that people be free to act upon their beliefs in both private worship and their actions in the public square.

The Bill of Rights is clear that Freedom of Religion is about the freedom to believe, or not believe, a religious doctrine or practice without interference from the government.

Therefore, government must remain neutral in regard to religious beliefs and cannot favor one religion for its beliefs or punish a religion for its beliefs.

What Does "Separation of Church and State" Really Mean?

- Many Americans are surprised to learn that the words, "Separation of Church and State" do not appear anywhere in the Constitution or Bill of Rights. This phrase is from a letter President Thomas Jefferson wrote in 1802 to the Danbury Baptist Association of Connecticut in response to their concerns about their Religious Freedom.

Jefferson used the metaphor "wall of separation between church and state" to explain restrictions that are only on the government and not on the people. At the heart of his assurance of a "wall of separation" is the guarantee that the government will not interfere with the peoples' rights to worship God as well as to practice their beliefs.

Today many choose to reverse the real meaning of Jefferson's words to place restrictions on people instead of on government.
