My Dear Family of St. Therese, GREETINGS FROM FLORIDA!

Having a wonderful time visiting with my brother (my original family) and his wife in Florida.

I left on a rather sad note. As I was in the office before I left I received an e-mail that informed me that Fran Ecker. What a loss for St. Therese and Montauk. Aside from being a great source of historical information, Fran was an excellent example of living the Christian life. My last time to enjoy her company was at the Friends of Erin luncheon. She was filling me in on the family tree and who was related to who in Montauk. She would point out this one and that one and only once said, "We're cousins, I'm not sure how, but we are related!"

That was one of the first things I was told when I arrived in Montauk - "We're ALL related!" Such a true statement, all of us at St. Therese, "WE ARE FAMILY!". I would consider Fran to be one of the Matriarchs of the St. Therese and Montauk Families. Her love for the St. Therese Family was more if not equal to her love for Montauk. Fran did not leave her faith at the church door, she put it into practice. I regret not being able to be present for her funeral, but knowing Fran she would say to me, "Go visit your brother, family is important!" If I had to choose a Gospel for Fran it would be Matthew 26: 31 - 40 "Whatsoever you do for one of the least of my brothers, you did for me!" Fran was the foundress of our parish food pantry, a woman who truly lived her faith. Fran did not shout about her faith on a street corner, she put her faith into action. For me, Fran was an example of what it means to be Even in her suffering she did not a Christian. complain.

Now for us comes the hardest part about being a Christian – finding comfort in our belief that Fran's life has changed, not ended.

HOUSEHOLDS IN GOD'S SERVICE

In the ancient world, "household" was a widereaching concept. When Joshua today speaks of his household serving the Lord, he meant not just those people who lived inside his walls or those related to him by blood or marriage; he meant slaves or servants and their families, and anyone indebted to him in any way. Even his livestock and other possessions would be consecrated to service of God. In our world, we value allowing individuals their freedom to choose how they live, and wouldn't think of offering our pets to the service of God. But, as we discern our vocation as disciples baptized into Christ, we can come to realize how far-ranging the "households" of our lives still are: how we act toward our spouses, children, roommates or anyone we live with; our behavior with neighbors; or in public as we encounter many "strangers" every day in stores or traffic who suddenly are "next door" to us. How can we use our time, our resources, or gifts for selfless reasons rather than personal gain? No matter what life our witness to the Good News calls us to, we all have a "household" that must be consecrated to service of the Lord our God.

We start our tour in Lourdes, the second most popular tourist city in France. Nestled by the foothills of the Pyrenees mountains, this city is the most visited pilgrimage shrine in the Christian world. Here we will learn more about St Bernadette and the story of this important Pilgrimage site. Then off to the beautiful Loire Valley and the city of Tours. 

School is Open!! And... YES, Students May Express Their Faith -(Part 1)

However, many Americans incorrectly believe that any mention of God by students in school is forbidden. This belief is false! Why do so many Americans believe this? How did we get here?

School-sponsored Prayer was removed from the public education system through a number of court cases over several decades. In 1963, the Supreme Court ruled on two cases that were brought by Madalyn Murray O'Hair in Maryland and the Schempp family in Pennsylvania.

The Supreme Court ruling stated **that** school-sponsored prayer and/or Bible reading by a representative of the State (teacher, etc.) was a violation of the establishment clause of the First Amendment.

Justice Hugo Black, writing for the majority said, "It is no part of the business of government to compose official prayers ..." This ruling did not stop school prayer or Bible reading completely since voluntary student prayer was still permitted and protected.

The widespread misinterpretation of the Supreme Court decision was caused by the news coverage and overly cautious School Boards.

While news services claimed prayer and Bible reading was expelled from public schools, Justice Tom Clark criticized their coverage, insisting the public was wrong to think the court had "outlawed religious observance in public."

Prof. Deckman of the Public Religious Research Institute said, "School Boards got so paranoid about dealing with religion (expression and

speech) that they just said, "We shouldn't do any of that at all!"

So - although the Supreme Court decisions did ban school-sponsored prayer and scripture readings, scholars agree that the court didn't ban religion from public schools or prohibit students from praying or expressing their religious beliefs.

<u>Nevertheless, for over 50 years, the misunderstanding</u> and misrepresentation of the 1963 Supreme Court ruling has led to countless cases that deny our children their First Amendment free exercise rights.
