My Dear Family of St. Therese,

Only one more weekend till the unofficial end of our season. As I have mentioned, it has been a very "full" summer. What I mean by that is the church has been full pretty much every weekend and our guests are a blessing to our parish. Our parish census has been quite a success and we will continue the reminder to reregister until Columbus Day Weekend when it seems to be the un-official end of our summer season.

This weekend in our Gospel we see the beginnings of our Church with the appointment of St. Peter as our first leader, our "Rock", our Father, our first Pope.

While the Papacy has not been the most pristine position throughout the centuries, it has been the most consistent. While all institutions have had their share of good and bad leaders. I think we have been blessed with our Popes of recent years.

My first recollection of a Pope was when I was young (very young) and our family went into the city and there was a wax figurine of Pope Pius XII in St. Patrick's Cathedral – I remember most of all, his ring! Next the cardinals elected Pope St. John XXIII. He seemed to be like a grandfather to his people, and while he was supposed to be a "do nothing Pope", he called the Vatican Council and opened the windows of the church to the Holy Spirit. Sadly, he was not to close the Council and Blessed Paul VI was next in line for The Chair. He was the first Pope to visit the United States (I remember watching the visit on TV -IN COLOR - at a neighbor's house). Blessed Paul was very scholarly and wise.

Following Blessed Paul was Pope John Paul I, the first time a Pope had taken two names! His intent was to unite the papacies of St. John and Blessed Paul in the time following the Vatican Council. Sadly, his time of service was very short. Our next Pope, St. John Paul II took up the baton of JP I to show the unity in the Papacy. St. John Paul's time of service was long and productive. His influence was far and wide. His papacy was so influential that his successor, Benedict XVI pushed for his canonization not long after his death. I think for all of us it was the first time someone became a saint who we knew. Benedict XVI will be remembered for his wish to return to the rich history of our church and for being the first pope in centuries to retire.

Our present Holy Father, Pope Francis, I think will be remembered as a Pope that did not just tell his people how to live the Gospel, he is showing us the way to live the Gospel.

We have a rich and blessed history in our church and a leader who is the most powerful man in the world. While most world leaders have authority over their own people, the authority of our Pope is worldwide.

God bless Pope Francis and God bless our family of faith!

BEAROCK

Peter's history as a follower or friend of Jesus is a bit spotty. It might be natural to wonder if Jesus, in giving him the keys to the kingdom, didn't feel a bit like a parent giving a teenager the keys to the family car. But it was at the moment when God's power and presence broke through everything else to raise up Peter's great profession of faith in Christ as Messiah that Jesus chose to establish the bond between the loving, forgiving mercy of heaven and our vocation to be witnesses of that love, mercy, and forgiveness on earth.

Like any parent, Jesus no doubt foresaw the failings, the irresponsible maneuvers or impaired senses, the collisions that the church would be headed for. But, most importantly, he also saw us at that moment as God prefers to see us: capable of manifesting great faith, with a willingness to remain at the feet of Christ to understand what it truly means to be Messiah and Christ. As the letter to the Romans points out to us today, we have not known the mind or the wisdom of God, but God knows us and still chooses to manifest the reign of justice, joy, beauty, and peace through us. 
