My Dear Family of St. Therese, 'LET THERE BE LIGHT!"

You may have noticed that the altar has more light shed upon it. Over the years, several spot lights burnt out and the altar and Risen Christ became more and more in the shadows. Last week "Ocean" Electric" came (with scaffolding) and replaced all the spot lights that focus on the sanctuary. Now, with the proper lighting, the Risen Christ is more powerful than before. When viewed from the center aisle, the shadow of the Risen Christ shows His arms out stretched and reveals crucifixion. The statue proclaims "from death to resurrection". The Risen Christ was also behind the altar of the old church.

Many objects in our newer church are from the old church. Aside from several of the stained glass windows, the rafters in the transepts of the church are also originals along with pews and wood work.

Once again we are in difficult times as we pray for justice and healing for the Body of Christ, the Church. It is always amazing how quickly scandal spreads and good news is ignored. When we as a parish had the misfortune of our parish credit card compromised, the newspaper was right on it with the police report. When I called to inform them that the incident had been settled and the funds returned, the reporter sounded disappointed. As they say "Bad news sells papers, not good news". Well here at St. Therese, we proclaim the "Good News".

Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

SEE BEYOND OUTWARD APPEARANCES

The phrase "Sunday best" has lost much of its meaning in our society today. Some lament the loss of people dressing up for church on Sunday; others think it's a healthy sign that we're as casual in attire gathered before the Lord as we are elsewhere. No matter which school of thought on this topic we belong to, James would probably chastise us. In either case, we are still focused on external appearance, mistaking it for some sort of favored position before God. True, James criticizes the community that favors the rich and welldressed while ostracizing the poorly clothed, but even more he criticizes the making of distinctions, making choices based on criteria that having nothing to do with the reign of God. James might turn our attention to the reign of God described by Isaiah, in which people are healed and the earth becomes ripe to bear fruit. Jesus today is focused on this reign of God, healing a Gentile man in a region hostile to his Jewish faith, not mindful of the man's origins or clothing or status or ability to repay. Isaiah, James, and Jesus in Mark's Gospel all call us to look more deeply to find where the will of God needs to be done, and has been done, on earth as in




Jesus Heals the Deaf Man

"In God We Trust", Our National Motto, posted in schools in more states!

The National Motto, "In God We Trust" first appeared on American currency in 1864 in the aftermath of the Civil War. President Eisenhower approved a law confirming it as the nation's motto in 1956, during the Cold War. "Our National Motto is enshrined in the House and Senate chambers in Washington. It's on the walls of the Capital Dome. The National Motto's declaration should be engraved not simply in stone but on the hearts and minds of our citizens, signifying our true strength and heritage as a people," said Dr. Mark Creech, Director of Christian Action League.

"Our National Motto is on our money, it's on our license plates. It's part of our National Anthem. Our National Motto and founding documents are the cornerstone of freedom, and we should teach our children about these things," said TN Rep. Susan Lynn.

"(Allowing) our National Motto, 'In God We Trust', back on the walls of our schools, is a reminder of hope and tolerance," said MN Sen. Dan Hall.

Lawmakers have approved measures requiring (or suggesting in some states) that "In God We Trust" be posted in schools in the following states:

Florida, Tennessee, Arkansas, South Carolina, North Carolina, Wyoming, Alabama, Oklahoma, Louisiana, Minnesota.

"It is quite obvious that the National Motto and the slogan on coinage and currency, 'In God We Trust' has nothing whatsoever to do with the establishment of religion. Its use is of patriotic or ceremonial character and bears no true resemblance to a governmental sponsorship of a religious exercise." U.S. 9th Circuit Court of Appeals, 1970
