LISTENING AND RESPONDING

There are three interwoven themes in today's readings: listening to God, faith vs. good works, and losing our life in order to find it. How are they related?

The Suffering Servant of Isaiah undergoes much distress and ridicule, but is able to bear it because he has listened to the promptings of God day after day. The psalm tells us that God listens, too. God hears our prayers for help and is always ready to save us. As our faith deepens, so does our desire to do the works of justice and charity that build up the reign of God. God directs our actions in ways we often cannot see, and we don't always see the results. We are called upon in faith to trust that what we do is enough, and that willingness to listen to God's promptings will lead us in the right way.

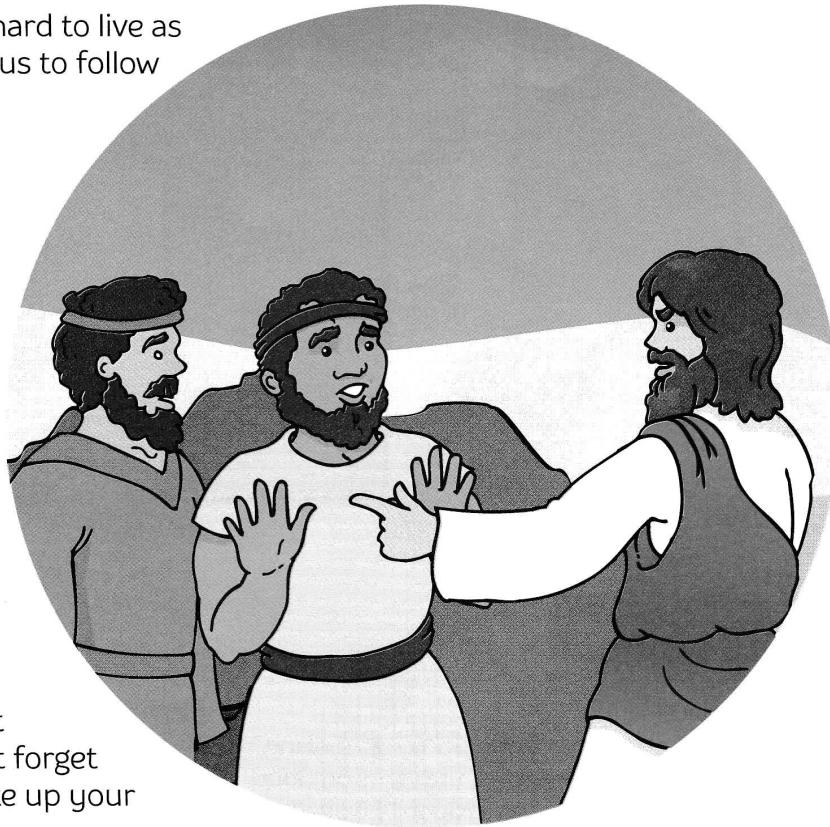


The Word of God This Week

Grassroots Effort Stalls Assault on Free Speech in CA

"**Good news!** Pro-family Californians now have more time to oppose AB2943. **This tyrannical bill, which eliminates your freedom to choose your own counselor and tramples your free speech and religious freedom, DID NOT** come up for a floor vote on the final day before ... vacation," said Randy Thomasson with SaveCalifornia.com.

Grassroots groups, realizing that most Californians were not aware of this bill, organized an education campaign explaining that AB2943 would have made it illegal to distribute resources, sell books, offer counseling services, or direct someone to a biblically based model for getting help with unwanted same-sex attraction or gender confusion.

AB2943 is the "**most egregious, tone-deaf, and discriminatory example of anti-religious legislation that I have witnessed (giving) terrifying power to target and punish all those who hold a traditional biblical view of marriage and sexuality,**" said Rev. Rodriguez, leader of National Hispanic Christian Leadership Conference.

A similar bill was stopped in the MA Legislature, also on the last day of the session.

Citizens Inundated Pentagon & Congress with telephone calls and emails urging the military to take swift action to exonerate Army chaplain, Maj. Scott Squires after he was accused of discrimination against a same-sex couple when he declined to lead a marriage retreat that included this couple.

"**The case of Chaplain Squires highlights how imperative it is that we protect freedom of conscience for every individual in the U.S. military** - including the chaplains who minister to them as they carry out the military's mission together," said Rep. Doug Collins.

"Chaplains ... do not have to give up their First Amendment rights in order to serve fellow soldiers," said First Liberty Institute.

"**The military Chaplains Corps has been a critical entity since the American Revolution. Commanders must allow chaplains to be chaplains and to practice their faith.** It appears there are commanders today that see them as social workers. This decision ... goes a long way to reinforcing what a chaplain is," said Lt-Gen (Ret.) William Boykin.
