My Dear Family of St. Therese,

This past week we had our monthly Nocturnal Adoration from Tuesday morning to Wednesday morning. It is sad at times to see how few turn out for this special time before the Eucharist in the Monstrance, but times have changed.

Originally the Christian Liturgy (The Mass) was celebrated in the language of the local people. While there is no certain proof of why the liturgy began to be celebrated solely in Latin, some believe it was Charlemagne, as Holy Roman Emperor who instituted this practice. In an effort to unite the Empire he chose the one language that was common among the aristocracy — Latin. In choosing this language, the average person was shut out from the Eucharist.

While they still believed that Christ was present in the Holy Sacrament, eventually the commoner became separated from the liturgy (literally separated by the altar rail). The people outside the altar rail believed that by looking upon the consecrated host, they received Jesus. Since they did not understand what was going on in the liturgy, a bell was rung to get their attention and to look up.

Soon the practice of receiving Jesus by gazing upon Him became the norm and when there was no Mass, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament began with Benediction (the blessing with the Monstrance).

Prior to Vatican II this practice remained. Plus the fact the people had to fast from Midnight on Saturday and were expected to go to Confession on Saturday did not foster the practice of receiving Communion. After the Vatican Council and the Mass was in the language of the people (the way it was intended to be) and fasting was reduced to one hour prior to receiving Communion, more people now receive the Eucharist. The idea of only by gazing upon the Host in the Monstrance has faded.

While Exposition and Benediction are a beautiful celebration of the Eucharist, there becomes the danger that we begin to think Jesus is more present when He is in the Monstrance – not true! He is ever present in the church in the tabernacle and anywhere among His people.

At St. Therese we continue to celebrate Exposition and Benediction every Tuesday after the 8:30 Mass (and every First Friday). All are invited to attend our Nocturnal Adoration, but keep in mind that we are always in His presence.


The Word of God This Week



Satanism & Religious Freedom:

The latest effort to normalize Satanism in America occurred on August 16 when the Satanic Temple paraded an 8 ½ foot-tall, one-ton demon statue to the Arkansas State Capital. The goal is to get Americans accustomed to the mistaken belief that Satanism is a protected religion by the First Amendment. It is not.

Nonetheless, these groups have won victories in Oklahoma, Minnesota, and Detroit as well as in after school programs in Washington State (to rival the Good News Club), and offering satanic curses to open a city council meeting in Alaska.

Knowing and understanding First Amendment Freedom of Religion protections is essential in order to refute the Satanists claims.

"The freedom of religion found in the First Amendment is a freedom to worship God according to the dictates of one's conscience - not the license to disparage or deride Him," wrote author Gunnar Gunderson. "Satanism is irreligion or antireligion ... Thus, granting Satanism religious-freedom protections undermines rather than strengthens religious-freedom rights by directly attacking their foundation. There is no evidence that either our Founders or founding citizens understood freedom of religion to include irreligion. Nor would such a right even make sense."
