My Dear Family of St. Therese,
This week we have one of the greatest privileges of being an American – the honor of voting. The Bishops of New York State call voting “Our Cherished Right and Our Solemn Duty”. Here are some excerpts from our Bishop’s statement as “**Guidance for Catholics for the Upcoming Election**”

“As Catholics we are called to look at politics as we are called to look at everything – through the lens of our faith. While we are free to join any political party we choose, or none at all, we must be cautious when we vote not to be guided solely by party loyalty or by personal interests.”

*“Unfortunately, it is the rare candidate who will agree with the Church on every issue. But, as the U.S. Bishops’ most recent document **Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship** makes clear, not every issue is of equal moral gravity. The inalienable right to life of every human person outweighs other concerns where Catholics may exercise prudential judgement (www.faithfulcitizenship.org). The right to life is the right through which all rights flow.”*

“We encourage you to properly form your consciences by reflecting on the moral and social teachings of our church, and we strongly urge you to vote on Election Day. Remember, when you cast your vote you are exercising your cherished right and solemn duty as both an American and a Catholic.”

GOD'S LAWS

God's laws are not intended to burden or torment us. Instead they are guideposts that point us in the direction of good living. Accordingly, good living requires loving God and loving one another. We should not follow God's laws out of fear of what might happen if we don't, but rather view them as a foundation for building relationships and trust with one another and with God.

The *Shema* prayer of Orthodox Jews is based on the reading from Deuteronomy today, "Hear, O Israel." Every morning people recite the prayer as a profession of their love for God and pledge their obedience to God throughout the day. They pass on their love of God to their children, from one generation to the next.

Ignoring Christian Genocide

Pakistan: Asia Bibi, a 37-year old Catholic married woman with children and a member of only 3 Christian families in her village was arrested in 2009 and charged with blasphemy after refusing to renounce Christianity following intense pressure from the Muslim women she worked with on a farm owned by a Muslim landowner. She was sentenced to death by hanging and has been in solitary confinement since 2010. "She is psychologically, physically and spiritually strong," said her husband. "She is spending her life praying with a very strong faith and is reading the Bible every day." No Christian in Pakistan has ever been executed under the blasphemy law, but in several cases, extremists have murdered Christians after their release from prison.

North Korea, China, South Korea: Seojun (not his real name) is a pastor today in South Korea but the North Korean secret service are still trying to find him and identify and harm his family members. Seojun escaped from North Korea and fled to China years ago but is now an influential Christian. As an illegal person in China, he faced danger since their police looked for North Koreans to send them back. He learned of an Open Doors safe house where he received food, shelter and protection. Overcoming his fear of a God, he was exposed to the Bible and Jesus. **"I could not understand it because I was so brainwashed by the North Korean education system since I was young,"** he said.

Nigeria: 15 year-old Leah Sharibu, the only Dapchi schoolgirl left who is refusing to renounce her Christian faith, faces death by her Boko Haram captors. Recently, the Catholic Bishops' Conference of Nigeria stated, "We demand that the (Nigerian) federal government secure the unconditional release of Leah Sharibu. She is still being held captive because she refused to denounce her Christian faith. We further demand that the federal government ensure the safe release of the remaining Chibok (school) girls and all other persons in captivity against their will."
