

Question: I was asked to explain what "The Steubenville Trip" means. It is talked about but never explained. We are asking for money, but for what?

My Answer: All great questions. Here we go.

Steubenville is a town in Ohio just north of Wheeling, WV following along the river. Actually when speaking of Steubenville and the Steubenville Youth Conference we are in particular speaking of Franciscan University, where the actual conference takes place. Franciscan University is a Catholic University run by the Franciscan Order of Friars. If you are a Scott Hahn fan, Scott is one of the many professors at Franciscan.

Now back to the Youth Conference. The Youth Conference is a conference for high school age boys and girls that provides a very Catholic venue for youth to gather together to worship and interface with other Catholic youth from around the country and even out of the country. The conference is a very high energy venue with lots and lots of Praise and Worship activities. The Liturgy of the Mass is full of modern Christian music as well as traditional music. This is all done in a very tasteful, but up to beat, fashion. There are some 2000 plus attendees so as you would expect it gets very loud.

The conference is, however, more than Mass Liturgies. There are workshops centering around positive life experiences and personal witnesses to Christ in their lives. Other workshops focus on how to live a Christian life in morality as a young woman or a young man while traversing the difficult decisions in a growing anti-Christian society. All workshops are upbeat and positive.

The thing that always gets me when I am at one of these conferences is the very Eucharistic nature of the conference. Friday evening and Saturday the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for adoration. Saturday evening the Blessed Sacrament is processed throughout the field house around the 2000 plus participants, all who are on their knees, praising the risen Lord. What a beautiful sight! What a humbling experience! There is no doubt that the Holy Spirit is working on this campus.

Now why do we ask, no beg, for money for Steubenville. As you would suspect, the conference has a cost. The cost, of course, increases each year. This year the cost is about \$200 per person. That gets one into the conference, lodging on campus (dorm rooms) and three meals a day (bag breakfast, lunch and dinner). The cost to get there and back is donated by the chaperones and drivers.

All in all this is one of the most Spirit driven events for a high school student and has the potential to be life changing and life directing.

Oh, by the way, one of the other moving experiences for me is when they call the boys and girls who may be experiencing a call to the religious life forward to the stage to be prayed over by the whole of the community. Wow! To see young people open to God's call. Right there in front of me. I see God working right then and there.
