

#### Ouestion:

I was asked a question that really comes up a lot in RCIA. The question is "Are Catholics allowed to receive communion in other churches of other Christian denominations or even other religions?"

#### My Answer:

As I said in our RCIA program in the Alderson Women's prison this comes up a lot. The main reason is because there are so many different Christian denominations on campus that the women try to find a church service somewhere and sometimes the services offer communion.

So I will give you the Church's answer. NO! You may also notice that I used a small 'c' in spelling communion above. But that's not good enough. We really need to know why the NO!

So let me explain. We are all called to be a witness to our faith and the hope we have in that faith. The word I use here is witness. So what do you believe and how does your belief witness to the hope we have for our salvation in Jesus Christ?

When we come forward at Communion during Mass we are witness to our belief that the One we receive is truly Jesus Christ, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. That is our ultimate witness, our statement of Faith for all to see. We need to be very careful then to not make anyone think that out Faith is in other than this witness that is that Jesus Christ is truly here with us in the Holy Eucharist.

Now let me give you a little thought as to why this is. As Roman Catholics we believe in the succession of hierarchy down through the centuries from what was handed to Peter and then through succession of imposition of hands from one successor of Peter to the next, unbroken. No other religion or other Christian faith can make that statement, but as Catholics we do.

Back to the witness. When someone goes forward or receives communion in another faith or religion there is the possibility of leading people to believe that there is no difference in what we believe, Transubstantiation, and what that particular faith believes communion is for them. Again, we are called to be witness to our Faith in what Jesus Christ himself established in the Apostles and handed down through the centuries. This is the Apostolic Faith that we as Roman Catholics believe and are called to witness to in the world.

So will you offend someone if you attend a Christian service and decline receiving communion? Very possibly, but what an opportunity to explain the Reason for Your Hope and the Faith that you have in Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.
