#### What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....? Question:

I was asked a question regarding other Catholic Churches, that is to say other Catholic Rites such as the Maronite Church. There's one in Roanoke VA.

#### My Answer:

Sometimes we Roman Catholics think we are the only Catholics in the world only to discover that there are about twenty four different Rites under the auspices of the Vicar of Rome, Pope Francis. That's right twenty four.

Greenbrier County And the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston are under the Roman or Latin Rite of the Catholic Church. That basically means we worship a particular way according to the Latin Rite. Here in the US we use the vernacular of English where the language of other cultures can also be used, e.g. Spanish, And French, And German, etc. The Liturgy is essentially the same except for the language.

However, there are other Rites within the Catholic Church where not only the language is different, but also the Rite itself may be different than the Roman Rite, which we are accustomed to.

St. Elias Maronite Church in Roanoke VA is one such Rite under the governance of the Holy Father Pope Francis. Although the Rite is different the truths of the Church as understood by all Catholics are upheld. These particular Rites might be lumped under the general category as the Eastern Rite Catholic Churches. Now this should not be confused with the Eastern Orthodox Church.

Just quickly there are several major headings of Rites in the Catholic Church: Latin Rite, Alexandrian Rite, Antiochian Rite, Chaldean or East Syrian Rite and Byzantine Rite. Under each of these there are sub rites adding up to about twenty four.

You may remember the news reports of the Coptic Christians being killed in the east. They are of the Alexandrian sect or rite.

Typically if you were to attend one of these rites you would be hearing a totally different language, maybe even Aramaic. We had a woman in the RCIA program at Alderson FPC that was from the Maronite Rite. She expressed to us that she was from the real Catholic Church since they spoke the ancient language that even Jesus would have spoken. That makes one think.

Anyway, when we get full of ourselves to think that we of the Latin Rite are the only one true Church, just take a look around and get a feel for our history. Maybe that's what we need.....A History lesson.
