#### Question:

So what's up with Purgatory? Where is it and how long are we there for?

#### My Answer:

So the first thing to be addressed is where Purgatory is located. This is easy. Per the Church, Purgatory is not a place. Our Spirit, once we leave our earthly bodies, doesn't go to a place. The Church is specific about Purgatory as being a process and not a physical place to wait to be called into heaven.

So what does it mean to be a process? The process is a purging of something. It can also be understood as purifying. In Scripture we hear of being purified by fire as gold is purified. But what needs to be purified?

The purging or purifying is of the temporal consequences of our actions here on earth. What did I just say? When we sin there are always consequences. We can never, well maybe, not always, repair the damage we cause from our actions, our sins. This is called temporal disorder or the temporal consequence.

It is important to understand that the temporal disorder is not sin. Temporal disorder is a consequence of the sin. The sin is already forgiven.

So the sin is forgiven, but the stain of the sin remains. This stain is what is being wiped away in the purging process, Purgatory.

It is important to understand that in order for us to be in the presence of God, who is all pure, we too must be pure. This is the reason for the purging or, as we call it, Purgatory.

So how long will we be in this process of purification? We tend to have an earthly concept of time. Our time here on earth is a product of man not of God. We hear of the notion of God's time. Well, Purgatory is really in the realm of God's time. We are called to pray for those who have died an earthly death at all times. This is because we don't really know how long one moves through this process of purification. So when Hank Richter offers intercession for those souls in Purgatory, think about it and offer prayer.
