Question: So when the Church says that the Pope can speak "infallibly", what exactly does that mean?

Answer: To speak infallibly is to speak without error or any possibility of error. The Pope speaks infallibly when he speaks from the Chair of Peter, "ex cathedra" or "from the chair". If the Pope speaks "ex cathedra" he must make it a public statement that he is speaking thusly so that it is not done in secret and is concerned only with Faith and Morals for the welfare of the Church Universal.

The statement of infallibility was promulgated, although long held as such, at Vatican I by Pope Pius the IX in the 1850's and who also proclaimed the infallible statement that the Blessed Virgin Mary was conceived without sin, The Immaculate Conception. This was done on December 8, 1854. The second modern infallible decree was in 1950 by Pope Pius the XII regarding the Assumption of Mary. Both are Dogma and as such must be believed by Catholics to be in Communion with the Church.

The other interesting fact is that the Pope is the Supreme Pontiff and as such has full authority over the Church. That means outside of any infallible statements being made, the Pope has the Divine Authority to make and change rules and laws that govern the Church, explicitly or implicitly. One such change, although subtle, was the washing of the feet at Holy Thursday Mass.

The rule of the Church was that at Holy Thursday Mass the Bishop or priest was to wash the feet of twelve men just as Jesus did for the Apostles in commemoration of the Last Supper. This rule obviously was not faithfully followed in any parish I have been in, but a rule none the less.

At Pope Francis' first Holy Thursday Mass he washed the feet of Men, Women, Children, non-Catholic and even non-Christians. This very act by the Pope effectively changed the rule.

The Pope is the head of the Church here on earth as Jesus is the head of the Body of Christ, The Church.
