

**Question:** I was asked, "I thought only a priest or Deacon can place the Sacred Vessels on the Altar. I saw you place them on the Altar last Sunday. Is that proper?"

Answer: That is correct, in a way. Only duly appointed Ministers are allowed to place anything on the Altar or take anything off of the Altar during the celebration of the Mass. However, in my case, being in formation for the diaconate, the bishop at various times, through his authority as an Apostle for Christ, will extend permission for those in formation to perform Liturgical functions beyond the norm. This has happened within the past year twice now in my case.

The first of these allowances came last May when the bishop installed me to the ministry of Lector. Lector is an official ministry within the Church and is sometimes confused with a Reader at Mass. We tend to use certain titles interchangeably, such as Reader and Lector. Officially a person is only a Lector if permitted by the bishop and includes more than reading at Mass. However, a duly appointed Lector is the ordinary reader when present at Mass.

The second of these allowances came this past November when the bishop installed me as Acolyte. Canonically (by Law) this must be done six months prior to being ordained as a Permanent Deacon. This will happen this coming May, so six months prior. The installation to Acolyte extends Liturgical privileges to be able to place Sacred Vessels on the Altar as well as to Ritual Purify the vessels after Holy Communion, something usually reserved to Deacons and priests. The reason for allowing Acolytes to do such things is so that once ordained the newly ordained Deacon doesn't make a fool of himself fumbling around at the Altar. In other words, to get comfortable, it's part of the practical training.

So all that being said, this is all part of the Diaconal Preparation and Formation that I have been going through for the past four and a half years. As we have come to understand that beyond the pure academic portion of the five year program some of the more important aspects center around pastoral care as well as Liturgical function.

So yes, as I get closer to ordination on May 7<sup>th</sup>, you will see more and more active participation in Liturgical functions, I hope......Peace.
