

Question: I was asked to get to it. "I hope your homilies won't be so long winded." Amen to that. So here are several ways to obtain and indulgence.

My Answer: Firstly let me give you a quick and frequent road to a partial indulgence. Receive Holy Communion in a state of grace with the intention of a partial indulgence and then recite the "Anima Christi" (Soul of Christ) prayer when you return to your seat. This can be found on page 229 in the missal found in the pew book rack. That's it. This is what I pray after each reception of the Holy Eucharist at each Mass.

For a Plenary Indulgence we have several great opportunities here in our parishes, most specifically on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays. On each of these days we can receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Holy Communion, Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father and at each of these times spend thirty minutes in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. On Monday mornings at St. Louis exposition of the Blessed Sacrament takes place for an hour from 7:15 to 8:15 before Mass which takes place at 8:30. Again on Tuesday morning there is Mass at 8:30 and exposition of the Blessed Sacrament takes place Tuesday evenings as has been for the past six years. Lastly on Thursday evenings there is exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 5:15 to 6:15 before Mass which takes place at 6:30. Reconciliation is available before each of these Masses.

To receive the Jubilee Year indulgence, you must fulfill the usual conditions, and perform the indulgenced act; passing through a designated Holy Door during the extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy (between Dec. 8, 2015, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, and Nov. 20, 2016, the Solemnity of Christ the King) or performing one of the corporal or spiritual works of mercy.

As for the sick and the elderly, the Holy Father says, "For them it will be of great help to live their sickness and suffering as an experience of closeness to the Lord who in the mystery of his Passion, death and Resurrection indicates the royal road which gives meaning to pain and loneliness. Living with faith and joyful hope this moment of trial, receiving communion or attending Holy Mass and community prayer, even through the various means of communication, will be for them the means of obtaining the Jubilee Indulgence."

The Holy Door was opened by Bishop Bransfield at the Cathedral in Wheeling on December 8. So all you need to do is pass through the door. Can it be any easier than that? I don't think so.

You may receive the plenary indulgence yourself, or offer it for a person in purgatory.......Peace
