Question:

So I'm standing around minding my own business and this person comes up to me and says, "If God is all knowing, that is, knows what we are going to be, choose etc. even before we are born, how exactly do we have free will?"

My Answer:

We tend to use those standard retorts to such deep and controversial questions like: "well our time is not God's time" or "we will find out when we leave this world" or better yet "if I knew that I would be God". How about just saying I don't know?

But let me take a stab at it.

All of the above answers really aren't that bad and are pretty close to a good answer although not very satisfying, at least not to me. So, I tend to think of things more in an earthly way, since I'm here on earth, and in a Godly way when I'm in the presence of God, say before the Blessed Sacrament.

In an earthly fashion, although I would like to think I have control over everything that happens to me and around me, the reality is that I don't. As I plan my day thinking of the things I would like to accomplish, by the end of the day that plan has just not worked out because of influences beyond my control. I adjust and change so that the best outcome might transpire. My choices are my own, however, good or bad. The consequences of my choices are what they are, but I made the choices. God knows, but I don't know what God knows. I only know what I know. So in essence I am free within the scope of myself to make those choices.

Now I will say that God knows what I know at any given time that I know it. I have been told by God that if I follow the ways of Christ I will have eternal life in God when I die as we all have the same possibility. God knows what we have decided in that regard even before we came into this world, Our Belief, and yet God brings us into this world anyway. Others may be brought into this world that we might be saved even though they may not. That's a sobering thought. We may be brought into this world to save others even though we may not be saved. That's an even more sobering thought.

So lots of thought, but still a more satisfactory answer is sought. In speaking of Peter's denial of Jesus and then Peter's conversion at the end versus Judas' denial and non-conversion, St. Augustine says ""Inscrutabilia sunt judicia Dei" (the judgments of God are inscrutable). Why did Peter have the grace to turn to Jesus and Judas not? Is one meant to save and the other to be saved?

I certainly can't top that.
