

Question:

I was asked the question, "What is the best way to receive Holy Communion, on the tongue or in the hand?"

My Answer:

My first reaction to the question and the way I wanted to answer was to receive Holy Communion in a *State of Grace*. Actually, that answer is exactly what we are called to do, not be in a state of Mortal Sin, in right acceptance of whom we are going to receive. We should be believers of the truth of the Eucharist as the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. This is our Catholic belief.

But to answer the question directly. The Church allows the reception of Holy Communion on either the tongue (I grew up this way) or in the hand. Is one more reverent then the other? Reverence comes from our belief in *who* we are receiving. If I believe that I am receiving God the Son, does it matter whether on the tongue or in the hand? If I receive unworthily, then it doesn't matter, again, whether in the hand or on the tongue.

What I am attempting to say is how we are disposed to receive lies within our hearts and our belief. God will sort out the rest.

Now that being said I will speak briefly on our witness as we receive. If one is to receive iin the hand, there is a proper way to do it. We witness to those around us by reverently placing our hands as an altar. We never snatch Jesus out of the hands of the priest. We *receive* Holy Communion, we don't *take* Holy Communion. The proper method of forming an altar is to place one hand over the other and elevate the altar so that the priest doesn't have to bend over to place Jesus on the altar. We should look the priest in the eyes and make our response of *Amen* have real meaning. By the way, Amen means "I believe" or as Fr. Larry Richards states it, "I Would Stake My Life On IT".
