

**Question:** Since I spoke of Divine Mercy last week and my dear sister Barbara, who likes to read my articles, said she had a hard time following what I was saying, I decided this week to relate a personal experience with the Divine Mercy Chaplet.

My Answer: Now if you are not familiar with the Divine Mercy Chaplet, it is a prayer given to us by Jesus Himself through St. Faustina. It is prayed using a standard five decade rosary, but utilizing the revealed prayers specifically requesting mercy.

So my experience goes like this.

When I was in Perrysburg, Ohio, I would visit the sick, but more specifically, we were assigned to a specific person to visit. One such person that I would visit each Sunday after Mass to bring her Holy Communion and to sit and chat awhile with was a woman named Julie. She was Catholic, but her husband was not. She was a cancer patient and during the almost year and a half we were together she would kind of go into remission and then back out. I brought her Communion each week because she was afraid of being in large crowds because her immune system was compromised. Very understandable.

Towards the end of this time period she started to deteriorate to the point she was placed in Hospice. I was blessed to be able to visit her there since it was very close to where we lived and even closer to the church that we attended. I would take her Communion, as always, Sunday after Mass. She related to me that she was angry at God for doing this thing to her, but she over the last few days of her life softened on this point.

I had been in the habit of praying on my way to work in the mornings, but the drive was too short to pray a Rosary, so I started to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet, which I could pray during that short drive after morning Mass.

Now one of the things about the Divine Mercy Chaplet that Jesus related to St. Faustina was that if you pray this prayer at the time of someone's death, Jesus will stand in place of judgement with all of His Mercy.

My drive to work from church typically took me out and around town so that I could hit the expressway, but this particular day I decided to take the drive along the river which took me right past the Hospice center where Julie was staying. This particular morning I was thinking of her and praying the Chaplet with no particular thought of anything being different. When I got to work and settled in I received a call from Julie's husband who told me that Julie had passed away that very morning. I couldn't help but think that it might have been at the time I was praying the Chaplet as I was driving by Hospice. Julie needed God's mercy at that time and Jesus was there.

# "When they say this chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the just judge, but as the Merciful Savior". (1541)

We would pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet to close Exposition and Adoration in Perrysburg at St. Rose. We do that even now at St. Catherine's on Tuesday evenings........Peace
