

**Question:** So I was asked about the raising of Lazarus, more specifically how could someone wrapped in burial clothes walk, talk and then what happened to him after all of that.

My Answer: An interesting question. Sometimes we just hear the Scripture passage being proclaimed, but never really stop to ask the question. "How could this be?"

First let's talk about what Scripture is there for to begin with. Scripture is our heritage in salvation. Scripure are stories of our Christian family through time, even to a time before we were called Christian. So it is all about our salvation through Christ Jesus. By the way, we are celebrating the greatest event in all of human history today, the resurrection of Jesus the Christ specifically for your eternal life.

Back to Lazarus. Remember, that until Jesus rises from the dead, the gates of heaven aren't really open. So Lazarus' death didn't find Lazarus in heaven and then yanked back into this earthly world. Lazarus was dead, of that we are certain, from Scripture. Lazarus was bound head to foot as was the burial custom at the time. So how could he walk out of the tomb? The phrase is always, "With God, all things are possible." Remember that this is a story of resurrection for the benefit of those who here. Literal readings aren't always what we are called to do. If Jesus said to come forth, Lazarus in obedience came forth.

What happened to Lazarus? Well Scripture again tells us that Jesus later on visited Lazarus, Mary and Martha. So Lazarus must have carried on with his normal life activities, that is, as normal as one can, having been raised from the dead! If it were me, I'd be going around the country side proclaiming what Jesus did for me. Oh Yah! That's what we are all called to do. Proclaim the Good News! By the way, That's the Gospel.

Obviously, since Lazarus is not around today, he would have died again. This time, we might suspect that Lazarus would go through the same process that we will go through upon our death, that is judgement, maybe Purgatory. That would be speculation on my part, but plausible.

We should keep in mind that today Jesus rose from the dead so that Lazarus would rise and that we might rise on that day we pass from this earthly life into the heavenly life for all eternity. Keep focused!! .......... Peace
