


Altar & Rosary Meeting time is changed to 9:45 AM, preceded by a devotion at 9:30. Still the first Tuesday of each month. Come join us!

What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....? Question:

Now and again I make a mis-statement in these Bulletin Articles and last week was one of them, so I want to first make a correction. I had used the word 'Antiquity" in place of the word 'Iniquity' as to what the priest celebrant says at the cleansing of his hands during the Offertory. The words are "Wash away my iniquity and cleanse me of my sin". It's great to know you are reading these articles.

Now for a question. I have received a number of questions and requests for clarification over the past week. Wow! I'm blown away. I will attempt to address them in the near future, but this coming week is Holy Week and I wanted to do, an ever so brief, description of the Liturgies that are so beautiful in the hope of participation in them by you.

My Answer:

This week in our Diocese starts with the Chrism Mass. This occurs twice in our Diocese as we are the state of West Virginia. The first is at the Co-Cathedral in Charleston on Monday and then again in Wheeling on Tuesday. The Chrism Mass is the one time during the year that the Sacred Oils, that are used for the various Rites; Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders, Dedications, Healings, are blessed by the Bishop Bransfield. This Mass is also a gathering of all the priests of the Diocese to come and restate their vow of obedience to the bishop. It's a spectacular and compelling Liturgy.

The next celebration is Holy Thursday, the Mass of the Last Supper. This Liturgy commemorates the establishment of the Holy Eucharist and a call to service in the Church as the Gospel reading is that of Jesus Washing the feet of the Apostles. Members of the congregation come forward to have their feet washed by the priest celebrant symbolizing the Last Supper washing of the Apostle's feet by Jesus. The Liturgy literally ends in silence with the procession of the Blessed Sacrament and a period of Adoration. Then there is the stripping of the Altar and the Sanctuary to indicate that Jesus has left to go to His final earthly mission, His death.

On Good Friday there is the Liturgy of The Veneration of the Cross. By the way, did you know that Good Friday is the only day of the year that there is no Mass celebrated? The Good Friday Liturgy includes Holy Communion, but there is no consecration of the Sacred Elements. The Body of Christ is consecrated on Holy Thursday and reposed for distribution on Friday. The Veneration of the Cross is the focus. The Cross is the ultimate Altar on which Jesus was sacrificed. We venerate the Altar.

Now the High Point of the Liturgical year, Easter Vigil. At this Liturgy we welcome those who have made a decisions to come fully into the Catholic Church, to be Baptized, Confirmed and to receive First Holy Communion. There is the blessing of the Easter/Paschal Candle, The Blessing of water and the commemoration of Salvation History by the seven Old Testament readings as well as the Epistle and Gospel Readings. If you've never attended an Easter Vigil Liturgy, I would Highly Recommend it.
