

What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....?

Question:

I was asked, "What is the difference between Adoration and Exposition?" and "What do you do during Adoration?"

My Answer:

The only real difference between Adoration and Exposition is that although both are Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament a particular way to adore Jesus is with Jesus exposed (Exposition) within a Sacred Vessel called a Monstrance.

Adoration of Jesus can be done by simply sitting or kneeling before the tabernacle of a church. There are no special requirements other than to adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Any person at any time can spend time in this manner.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is a little more involved. Exposition should take place with a number of persons present. Exposition is not to be a private time with Jesus. In other words, Exposition is more of a Liturgy than simple adoration.

At this time I will say the word "Adoration" comes from the Greek "Ad Ora" translated "Mouth to Mouth" or as I say voice to voice or a conversation. So to answer the question as to what one does at Adoration or Exposition is to have a conversation with Jesus.

We need to be silent. That silence allows us to have a conversation with Jesus. This can occur during Adoration or I should say, will occur, if we allow it to happen.

Once you experience this conversation "Ad Ora" it becomes a profound way of communication, not necessarily us to God, but God to us.

Every Monday morning at St. Louis in Lewisburg from 7:15 to 8:15 before mass, Tuesday at St. Catherine of Sienna in Ronceverte from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00p.m. and Thursday evenings from 5:15 to 6:15 before mass, there is the possibility of experiencing this "Ad Ora", a conversation with God.

You really need to try this if you have never made a Holy Hour before. It's marvelous experience.
