The Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary. (A discipline of daily prayer and preparation for renewal of Christian Faith)

St. Louis de Montfort's spirituality of "Total Consecration" brought a great renewal of faith to many French parishes of the 16th and 17 centuries. His writings on the place of Mary in our faith and on this approach spiritual growth was the basis of his canonization as a saint in 1947. St. Louis de Montfort also established orders for men and women in consecrated life. One of those, the Missionaries of the Company of Mary, continues the teachings of St. Louis and the publication of his writings.

Following the writings of this saint, we will offer a series not just study, but of prayer and spiritual growth in preparation for Lent. It will begin at St. Louis Parish Church in Lewisburg on Saturday, February 18th at 5pm, just after Mass and will end at Mass on Saturday, March 25, the Feast of the Annunciation.



What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....? Ouestion:

I'd like to take a slight diversion from the parts of the Mass to look at the gestures we use during the Mass. Seems like a good place for this.

My Answer:

We all will recognize that we use different gestures at different times during the Mass. Wouldn't it be great to know why we do this? Of course it would.

Let's start with the most basic of Catholic gestures, the Sign of the Cross.

The Sign of the Cross should bring to mind our Trinitarian belief in the One True God; Father, Son, Holy Spirit. So whenever we make the Sign of the Cross it should bring the Trinity to mind.

So what does the Sign of the Cross with Holy Water mean as we enter church? It is the sign of our Baptism. We tend to think that once we are baptized, that's it, but we can call upon our Baptismal Grace when we recall our Baptism by dipping our hand into the Holy Water and pronounce the words, In the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Each and every time we enter church. Yes, Baptismal Grace!

How about the standing, kneeling and sitting? Each of these has a significance.

Standing is a sign of respect or honoring. We stand at the procession into church. We stand at the Gospel reading, the words of Jesus Christ. We stand at the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer.

Kneeling is a sign of Penance, but more so it is a sign of Adoration. We kneel when it comes to the Consecration of the bread and wine.

Sitting is a posture of listening and meditation. We sit to listen to the first two readings. We sit during the homily. We sit after Communion to meditate on whom we just received.

Some lesser noticed signs. The striking of the breast during the Confiteor, the triple sign of the cross just before the reading of the Gospel and the bow we make during the Creed.

The striking of our breast during the Confiteor is a sign of acknowledging that our sin is truly our fault and not the fault of anyone else.

The triple Sign of the Cross on the forehead, lips and breast right before the Gospel is asking that the words we hear are to always be on our mind, to always be on our lips and that they will always be in our hearts.

During the Creed at the reference to the Incarnation of God in the Son we bow to acknowledge the salvific nature of that Act of Love of God for us to come to earth in the flesh, only to die and then rise

Wait! I forgot the Bells! Why do we have bells sounding during Mass?

The bells are to draw our attention to something important. As our servers could tell you, the bells are rung three different times so that the congregation will watch carefully. The first is a single ring at the time of the Epiclesis, the calling on God to send the Holy Spirit to change the bread and the wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus. The next two times will be a triple ring at the elevation of the Body and then again the Blood of Jesus. OOPS! Out of Space Again! Until next week.
