What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....?

Question:

So, taking a break from the Sacraments to talk about Ash Wednesday and the upcoming season of Lent.

My Answer:

Ash Wednesday is the kick off to the season of Lent a period of time of fasting, reconciliation and inner reflection on who Jesus Christ is and what He did and why he did it.

Lent is the forty-day period starting with Ash Wednesday, a day of fasting and abstinence. Ah! Fasting and Abstinence!

Let's start with fasting. Fasting is a sacrifice that we make to bring us into the life of Jesus and his Passion and Death. Fasting is freely giving up eating our normal daily meals so that we eat sparingly with the sacrifice of eating only one full meal during the day with eating two minimal meals the rest of the day. Yes, this is a sacrifice we make willingly for the sake of our relationship with Jesus.

How about abstinence? Abstinence is refraining from eating meat. Meat being anything that walks upon the earth; beef, chicken, turkey, lamb, goat. You get the idea.

When does this take place? Well fasting is obligatory on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Abstinence is obligatory on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during the season of Lent. I tend to not like the word obligatory or obligation. I tend to like the word opportunity, opportunity to come closer to Jesus in His life, death and eventually His Resurrection.

So, there are age groupings for each of these. All are called to abstinence from meat starting at age 14 until the day, well, the rest of your life. Fasting on the other hand starts at age 18 and goes until the age of 60. Now let's think about this. So, if you are 60 or over you are not under the obligation. I would submit that, if at all possible, one might consider not the obligation, but the privilege to sacrifice something for the one who sacrificed everything just for me, even if I'm 60 or older.

Back to Ash Wednesday. So why ashes? Liturgy is always full of symbolism. So what better way to start a season of repentance and reflection by symbolizing our dying to self by looking at our humanity and the inevitable end in dust? Ashes symbolize our rise from ashes, dust and our return to dust, ashes. The words we hear on Ash Wednesday "Remember, Man is dust, and unto dust you shall return" Speak plainly about where we came from and where we are eventually going. A remembrance of our closeness to God for eternity.
