What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....? Question:

My sister says this is the part she's been waiting for, the Eucharistic Prayer.

My Answer:

This is often times called the Meat of the Mass. Well put. The Meat, the Incarnate Son of God arrives. The Body, Blood Soul and Divinity of Jesus comes to us as promised by no other than Jesus the Christ Himself. But I get ahead of myself. You can see that I am excited too. I guess my sister and I are from the same genes!

The Eucharistic celebration starts with the prayer that we call the Preface. As maybe in a book, it is the introduction to what is going to come in just a few minutes. The Preface is the prayer that sets the tone of the rest of the Mass. The Preface is tied specifically to the seasons of the Church, Ordinary Time, Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter. However, as always within the Church, there are special occasion that we celebrate, the Solemnities, the Feasts, the Memorials. Sounds complicated, but really it's pretty straight forward. The Church has laid it out so all that has to be done is follow the Order Prescribed, No Adlibbing. There are eleven Prefaces in the Roman Missal, the text that we use for Mass.

The Preface is the Prayer of Thanksgiving as expressed by the priest for the whole of the people of God. You can tell when this happens as the priest will say "The Lord be with You" as we respond "And with your Spirit". Then the priest says "Lift up your hearts" and we respond "We lift them up to the Lord". Then finally the priest says "Let us give thanks to the Lord our God" (did you hear Thanks) and we respond "It is Right and Just". Now the next words spoken flow right from our response when the priest says "It is truly right and just, our duty and out salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks". Truly a prayer of thanksgiving.

At this point the priest will be reading from the text most appropriate for the particular celebration of this particular Mass. Now there are some choices to be made on any given Sunday Liturgy by the priest, but limited for sure. Again, there are eleven Prefaces within the Roman Missal.

The Preface ends when we sing the Holy, Holy, Holy Lord (Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus) and marks the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer. This acclamation is made by the priest and congregation together.

Now in preparation for next week it should be noted as to specific actions that you will want to pay close attention to as we proceed into the actual Eucharistic Prayers. Words like *epiclesis* (E-Pic-Le-Sis), *anamnesis* (An-am-Ne-Sis).

The *epiclesis* is the calling down of the Holy Spirit to do something. That something is to effect a change is something or someone, in the Mass that is to change the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

The *anamnesis* is the recalling of Jesus' gift to us in the Eucharist.
