#### What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....? **Ouestion:**

Deacon, really, could you just get on with it? What are the parts of the Mass?

#### Mv Answer:

We will start as we do at Mass with the Entrance Rite. As the Rite indicates, it is the entrance into the Mass, actually the church, and thus begins the total Liturgy of the Mass.

The entrance would typically include the Priest, Deacon, Servers and other Ministers of the Mass as required. The Mass will typically start with an Entrance Song or Hymn. The reason for this is to alert the faithful that we are starting and is to set the tone or mood of the Mass. What do I mean by that? The tone or mood is dependent on the season of the Church. You will notice more solemn hymns during the Advent and Lenten Liturgies and much more upbeat during the Christmas and Easter seasons. So we should know by the hymns alone what season we are in. Also a good telltale sign would be the vestment colors, Green for Ordinary Time, Purple for the solemn times of Advent and Lent, White for the Christmas and Easter Seasons. Then mix in a few Red Days like Pentecost and Martyrs in for good measure.

Once into the Sanctuary the Penitential Rite begins. This is an opportunity to relieve yourself from Venial Sin if properly disposed. As a note, Confession is the ordinary way to forgiveness of sin. At this point the priest would say, Let us call to mind our sins. Then, May Almighty God forgive us our sins. And, Lord Have Mercy, Christ Have Mercy, Lord Have Mercy.

Now, depending on the season, the Gloria would be sung. During the preparation seasons of Advent and Lent the Gloria is not sung.

Now come those wonderful words, Let Us Pray. That means we, through the priest, are offering the *Collect* prayer. This is when the server brings that BIG BOOK to the priest. That BIG BOOK is called the Roman Missal and is used throughout the Mass.

Just a quick note here, The Roman Missal contains all of the prayers necessary for a Mass to take place. Although there are certain choices of prayer at certain times during the Mass, that the celebrant can use, the prayers must be said in the manner as specified within the Roman Missal. In other words, NO ADLIBING ALLOWED.

At this stage of the Mass the Entrance Rite is concluded and we move on to the Liturgy of the Word. And yes my dear sister, we have to wait until next week as we continue through the Mass.
