What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....? Ouestion:

So I was asked to say something about my experience at the USCCB bishops Convocation in Orlando this past weekend. You did here about it? Not surprising!

My Answer:

Let me start by saying, I just flew in from Orlando and boy are my arms tired! Ya! Pretty lame!

Convocation is not a conference or seminar or workshop. Well maybe a little bit of a workshop. Convocation is a gathering of people to discuss a matter of importance. I'm making this about importance since I was chosen as one of the bishop's delegates to the Convocation. And since this was called by the United States Bishops all of the dioceses across the United States sent a delegation to attend and take part in the discussions. Wow! I'm feeling kind of important right about now. I'll get over it.

So just exactly what was the important matter at hand? To put it simply, The Joy of the Gospel. Now before you say, What, you should know that this is the title of the Papal letter authored by Pope Francis in which he describes the need to be joyful in our witness to Christ Jesus and to the Gospel message. To witness to our faith in a joyful way. As one Cardinal put it, Don't be a sour puss!

The theme throughout the four days of the Convocation was how to be a Missionary Disciple. In other words, how do we evangelize to others in a way that is inviting and desirable. Again, if you are a person that is glum and gloomy, on God's good earth why would anyone want to be a disciple of Jesus? "Don't be a sour puss" Don't be a gloomy Gus.

The Plenary Sessions where hosted by one of the various Bishops, Archbishops or Cardinals. In fact even the many breakout sessions were MC'ed by at least two bishops along with a discussion panel. Cool. I've never seen so many bishops, archbishops or cardinals in one spot except at a Papal Mass.

The breakout sessions were not presentations, but discussion groups, guided by a panel and the moderator bishops. Small groups at each breakout sessions were formed and discussed the topic at hand. After a moderate amount of time the small groups presented their discussion points to the bishops and the panel and to the whole group. These points will be taken under advisement. Again, this was convocation not a conference.

By the way. The last convocation that was called in the United States was one hundred years ago. You heard me right. One hundred years. So one would suspect that it was pretty important. Then why was I there? Good question.

So how are we to be Missionary Disciples? Through a deepening of our relationship with Jesus and witnessing to the Joy that relationship brings to us to others drawing them into a relationship or deepening their relationship. To invite! This is the Mission. We invite someone we have never seen before to sit with us at Mass or maybe someone we know who has left the Church or someone we know who is seeking. Our Joyful witness to Christ in our lives is the key to being a Missionary Disciple.

The Joy is in the Good News, Gospel.
