



What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....? Question:

I was asked this question, "I want to buy a missal, should I get a weekend and holidays edition or the full Kaboom? Printed or digital. Start slow or jump right in?"

My Answer:

I know there are a lot of opinions that people have in regard to what to buy, what to use, but I was the one asked, so here I go.

First let's talk a bit about 'A Missal' and what it is. The official description I take from the New Advent Encyclopedia which says:

(Latin Missale from Missa, Mass), the book which contains the prayers said by the priest at the altar as well as all that is officially read or sung in connection with the offering of the holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the ecclesiastical year.

Now the official Missal is the one that you see up on the altar that the priest uses in the celebration of Mass. It contains every word spoken in prayer during the Mass Liturgy. It provides not only the words spoken, but instructions on hand positions, genuflection and the like.

So quite a few people have daily missals that not only have the mass liturgies, with the people's responses and the Scripture passages for the day, but possibly the Eucharistic Prayers and even the morning and evening prayers from the Breviary.

There are several that I know of and that I have used in the past. There are many devotional booklets that also hold inspiring reflections upon Scripture, all very good especially for the spirit within us. But, if you are looking at praying with the Church each day, then here are a few suggestions. I also invite those of you out there using something different to please share your experiences.

The three that come to mind that I have used are "Living with Christ", "The Word Among Us" and "The Magnificat". All three great reflections, but all three are subscription based typically for a month. All three reflect changes in seasons and will offer different reflections over the years. There are the official daily missals of the Roman Rite if you are a purest. I really feel that the subscription based missals that offer reflections are a great way to enter into daily prayer.

Wow! Getting a little wordy here!

I presently have a subscription to "Living in Christ". It offers some great reflections that can inspire a homily or two, but if you are looking for the Full Kaboom, I would recommend a subscription to The Magnificat. The reason is that The Magnificat adds to the daily Mass the portions of the Liturgy of the Hours morning prayer and evening prayer as well as the order of the Mass. It is the total package for someone who wishes to Pray with the Church. When I first got into this mode of praying the Magnificat was what I chose

I hope this little article will answer questions and inspire those of you who want to go deeper into a daily prayer life to think about these options. Obviously there are many more ways to pray daily. There are very many other devotions. The thing is that we all choose something that calls us to prayer and a deeper relationship with God.


