What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....? Ouestion:

I want to address a subject based on a homily I heard while in South Carolina last weekend.

Mv Answer:

So the homily was delivered on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Jesus. Here's how it went.

The priest used these statistics, from where I can't remember, regarding the belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. See what you think.

Three groups of those professing to be Catholic were surveyed with the following results.

The first group were those that are typically called C&E's, Christmas and Easter attendees. When asked if they believed in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament at Holy Communion the response was that about 42% of those surveyed said they did believe in the Real Presence.

The second group were those who attend more than Christmas and Easter, but not regularly throughout the year. When asked if they believed in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament at Holy Communion the response was about 65% of those surveyed said that they did believe in the Real Presence.

The third group were those who attend Mass regularly throughout the year. When asked if they believed in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament at Holy Communion the response was about 95% of those surveyed said that they did believe in the Real Presence.

Now I am adding my own little survey result to this mix. When asked of those who attend Mass regularly and who also spend time before the Blessed Sacrament in Adoration outside of Mass the response was 100% of those surveyed said that they believed in the Real Presence.

Now statistics are great. You can draw a lot of different conclusions from them. The priest listed several comments regarding the responses, such as of those who don't attend regularly said that they just don't get anything out of Mass. This is a typical response. I JUST DON'T GET ANYTHING OUT OF MASS! Yikes!

Now here's my two cents thrown into the mix. The Catholic Church clearly states that the Holy Eucharist is the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. The Church further states that this is a Dogma of the Church. A Dogma is a statement of belief that must be believed to be Catholic. So look at the statistics of those who profess to be Catholic. You just have to wonder.

No wonder that if someone says they just don't get anything out of Mass they can't hardly say they believe in the Real Presence of the God of the Universe. And if the God of the Universe is present at Mass, how can someone say they don't get anything out of the Mass? Someone please help me here! I know these people. They are right here in this community. I have even heard it said, "I believe in the Eucharist, but the Mass doesn't move me". Wow! How can I relate the beauty of this Most Precious Gift given to us from Jesus Himself? What more can be said?


