**What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....?**

**Question:**

Now to the Sacraments of Vocation. The Call from God to each of us to live out a life of holiness, a life of Christ Jesus in a particular way.

**My Answer:**

There are two Sacraments of Vocation and the one I will talk about today is the Sacrament of Marriage, the Sacrament where by a woman and a man come together Sacramentally to live out the rest of their natural lives in the service of God.

**CCC1638** "From a valid marriage arises a bond between the spouses which by its very nature is perpetual and exclusive; furthermore, in a Christian marriage the spouses are strengthened and, as it were, consecrated for the duties and the dignity of their state by a special sacrament."

**CCC1640** Thus the marriage bond has been established by God himself in such a way that a marriage concluded and consummated between baptized persons can never be dissolved. This bond, which results from the free human act of the spouses and their consummation of the marriage, is a reality, henceforth irrevocable, and gives rise to a covenant guaranteed by God's fidelity. the Church does not have the power to contravene this disposition of divine wisdom.

**CCC1621** In the Latin Rite the celebration of marriage between two Catholic faithful normally takes place during Holy Mass, because of the connection of all the sacraments with the Paschal mystery of Christ. In the Eucharist the memorial of the New Covenant is realized, the New Covenant in which Christ has united himself for ever to the Church, his beloved bride for whom he gave himself up. It is therefore fitting that the spouses should seal their consent to give themselves to each other through the offering of their own lives by uniting it to the offering of Christ for his Church made present in the Eucharistic sacrifice, and by receiving the Eucharist so that, communicating in the same Body and the same Blood of Christ, they may form but "one body" in Christ.  
**CCC1623** In the Latin Church, it is ordinarily understood that the spouses, as ministers of Christ's grace, mutually confer upon each other the sacrament of Matrimony by expressing their consent before the Church. In the Eastern liturgies the minister of this sacrament (which is called "Crowning") is the priest or bishop who, after receiving the mutual consent of the spouses, successively crowns the bridegroom and the bride as a sign of the marriage covenant.

This last reference means that the woman and man confer the Sacrament on each other, together with the bishop, priest or deacon as the official witness to the Sacrament for the Church. Also, it is stated that this is within the Latin Rite of the Church. By the way. We are the Latin Rite here in our parishes and this Diocese.
