



#### What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....? **Ouestion:**

I need to address two questions before we get started. First, when a deacon goes to read the Gospel does the priest pray over him? The second one I can't quite remember. Oh Well!

## Mv Answer:

So before I launch into the next section of the Mass the prayer that is prayed over the Deacon is as follows: "May the Lord be in your heart and on your lips, that you may proclaim his Gospel worthily and well, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit". These words always strike me as to the importance of proclaiming the Gospel, well.

After the Eucharistic Prayer is prayed the next thing to have happen is the Sacrament within the Mass, Holy Communion. That is correct. The Mass is not the Sacrament. The Sacrament is contained in the Mass. That is why a Communion Service without a priest is the same Sacrament that is contained in the Mass. The Mass provides the vehicle to have Holy Communion. That is, that the priest is necessary for consecration of the bread and wine transubstantiated into the Body and Blood of Jesus. This can only take place within a Mass.

So let me speak about how we are to receive the Blessed Sacrament. St. Paul is very specific about this point. We must receive Jesus worthily. Worthily means to be fully prepared and fully understand who we are receiving, not what we are receiving. That would mean that we are not aware of having committed an unconfessed Mortal Sin. That we are fully conscious of who we are about to receive. Oh ya! And the proper response when presented with the Body and Blood of Jesus is AMEN, not, thank you or nothing at all. The response amen means, I Believe and what I believe is that who is right in front of me is Jesus Himself. So now after Communion you might see the priest, but especially the Deacon, if one be present, doing something with the vessels used during distribution of Holy Communion. That would be the paten and cups that held the Body and Blood of Jesus. The process after Communion is called Purification of

the vessels. This is done by using a small amount of water introduced into the cups that held the Precious Blood and the paten that held the Body of Christ is brushed with the fingers into the cup of any remaining particles. Then this is consumed by the priest or deacon. The prayer that is said while purifying is, "What has passed our lips as food, O Lord, may we possess in purity of heart, that what has been given in time may be our healing for eternity".

Well we are coming close to the end of the Mass. Maybe one or two more articles and we can call it quits. Deacon Tom
