What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....?

Question:

I seem to be struggling lately with getting things around, so I turn to our Blessed Mother Mary, especially in the month of May. I was asked to explain the indulgences associated with praying the Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

My Answer:

There are two types of indulgences, partial and plenary. Partial being, as the name indicates, not total, while a plenary indulgence is total, all, complete.

But, you might ask, what is an indulgence anyway? Well I wrote about this in 2015, but here's a quick reminder. An indulgence is a granting of the remission, or taking away, of the temporal punishment associated with committing a sin, that is confessed by the way, that we suffer in Purgatory as we head towards meeting God face to face. Wow! That's a lot. To put it plainly. You can't meet God face to face if you are not pure of heart. Purgatory cleanses us of this temporal punishment or disorder. That's what the Church teaches and holds to. An indulgence then is the releasing of that which keeps us in Purgatory.

Now, how does the Rosary help remit, take away, that time spent in cleansing while in Purgatory? Well, here's the Church's stance on the indulgences associated with the Rosary.

A Plenary Indulgence...

may be gained (under the usual conditions) when the Rosary is prayed in Church, in a family group or in a religious community. Also:

- Five (5) decades of the Rosary must be prayed continuously.
- The prayers of the Rosary must be prayed vocally and one must meditate upon the Mysteries of the Rosary.
- If the recitation of the Rosary is public, the Mysteries of the Rosary must be announced.

A Partial Indulgence...

One may gain a partial indulgence for the Rosary's recitation in whole or in part in other circumstances.

A Plenary Indulgence...

can be gained only once a day (except by those who are in danger of death.)

* to gain a plenary indulgence one must perform the indulgenced act. **Three other conditions must be fulfilled:**

- 1. A sacramental confession**
- 2. Eucharistic Communion**
- 3. Prayers for the Pope's intentions**

In addition, **one must be free of all attachments to sin**, even venial sin. If this complete integrity is not present or if the above conditions are not fulfilled the indulgence is only partial. **Both a plenary and partial indulgence may be applied to the dead.**
