What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....? Ouestion:

I was asked to explain, just what are the requirements for fasting before Mass or Holy Communion.

My Answer:

I'm not really sure, but I might have written about this in the distant past, but here it goes.

The first thing to do is to understand what this action of fasting really means. Actually, it is a depriving of oneself of a pleasure or comfort, as eating tends to be just that. Certainly, if a person was starving, fasting doesn't make much sense. That would be depriving oneself of a necessity. So we are giving something up for our good. I said our good, not God's good. Oh Oh! Sounds like a heresy coming! Everything that the Church would mandate is for our good. The good is to direct us towards Jesus and our salvation through Jesus. Please keep this in mind, you regulators, because the Church has changed fasting rules over the years, even since I was born, oh so many years ago. Although the regulations have changed the reason has not changed. The reason?? The reason is to prepare ourselves mentally and spiritually to receive the God of the Universe, the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of God God's self. It is a recognition of Who we receive and for what purpose Jesus said, "Eat my flesh and drink my Blood".

The current regulation for fasting before receiving Holy Communion is that you abstain from eating and drinking, other than water, one hour before receiving Holy Communion. There are those who ask, is it one hour before Communion or one hour before Mass. Well if you are a time keeper you should fast one hour before Mass because you will never be able to time exactly when Holy Communion will take place. But then, you are missing the whole point of fasting, aren't you.

You know when I was growing up during the years of the Latin Mass we were told not to chew the host because it was Jesus and that we had to let Jesus melt in our mouths. Also, we were told that we had to fast because we didn't want anything in our stomachs when we swallowed Jesus. Missed the whole point didn't it. Fasting is a preparation for receiving Jesus. It has literally nothing to do with Physiology. I think back to the words of Jesus, "Nothing outside the body is unholy. It is only what is within". Jesus is talking about our intent, our attitude toward what God has provided. So let's get our heads on straight to this point. We are preparing ourselves spiritually to receive a great gift that God has provided of Himself. Am I rambling?

To let you newbies know what I grew up with, I started with fasting from Midnight until Mass that day. Then it was changed to three hours before Mass. Notice I am using the word Mass, as it was taught. Then the regulation changed to the present one hour. As you can see, the intent of the fast has not changed, just the time requirement.

Let me just say in closing, Connie is hoping that I do this quickly, we should be preparing to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament of Communion well before the fast takes place. Receiving Jesus, the God of the Universe, should be an ongoing preparation. Just a thought.
