What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....?

Question:

I was asked to explain the Biblical source for the Doctrine of Purgatory and how it might be explained to someone who struggles or doesn't believe in a Purgatory.

My Answer:

This isn't the first time I've written an article in regard to Purgatory, in fact, I've written two articles previously over the past two years. It's a Doctrine that seems to be hard to get your arms around. So here it goes.

First the Biblical reference for the Doctrine of Purgatory comes from the Old Testament in the Book of 2nd Maccabees 12:39-46:

Judas Maccabeus and members of his Jewish military forces collecting the bodies of some fallen comrades who had been killed in battle. When they discovered these men were carrying "sacred tokens of the idols of Jamnia, which the law forbids the Jews to wear" (vs. 40), Judas and his companions discerned they had died as a punishment for sin. Therefore, Judas and his men "turned to prayer beseeching that the sin which had been committed might be wholly blotted out... He also took up a collection... and sent it to Jerusalem to provide for a sin offering. In doing this he acted very well and honorably... Therefore he made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin."

It all really makes a lot of sense. If a soul is in heaven or even hell, there is no real reason to pray for the dead as they will already be in the final state, either the state of Peace or the state of Dread.

We pray for the dead that they may see Heaven and be with the God of the Universe for all of eternity. We do acts of indulgence to relieve some or all of the time that would be required for their cleansing of the stains left by sin. We pray that God will have all mercy, as God is all merciful to those who seek God's mercy and as such we pray for this to be so.

Praying for the dead isn't just an idle prayer. We should put our hearts and soul into this prayer. When you hear someone who says, Let us pray for the souls in Purgatory, be ever mindful of those loved ones who may be waiting to enter fully into the realm that we call heaven.
