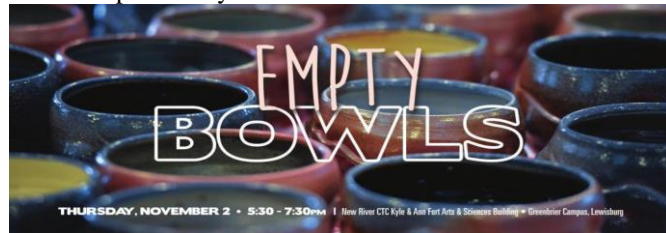

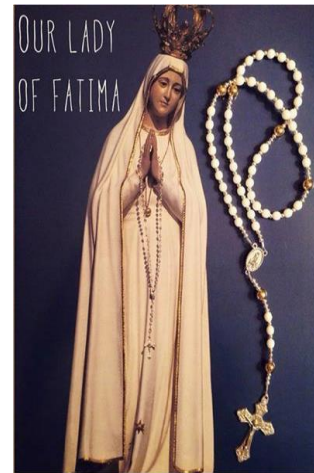

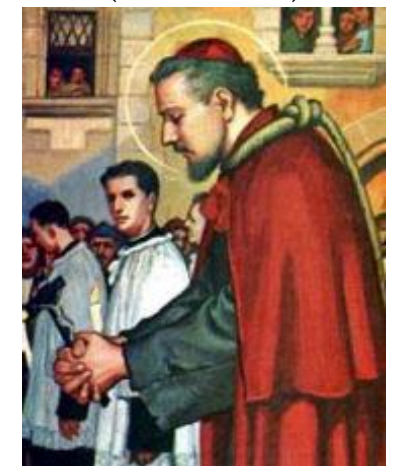

What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....?

Question:

I was asked to explain a Scapular vs. a Scapular medal; and also the requirements of the Scapular itself.

My Answer:

This is the most difficult and potentially confusing article that I have written, but here it goes.

First, the Scapular is a garment worn over the shoulders, derived from scapulae, which is Latin for shoulder, go figure; and is a sign of a certain commitment to a practice of devout living through an intercessor, that is, living a life in Christ Jesus. Wow! That being said, the typical Scapular that is worn present day is made up of two cloth squares connected by straps that allow the Scapular to drape across the shoulders so that the cloth pieces set on the chest and in the back of the person wearing the Scapular.

To wear a Scapular and be afforded the protections and indulgences associated with the particular Scapular, the person must be vested in the Scapular by a duly approved person and must follow the prescripts of the particular Scapular. Indulgences and protection from eternal damnation are the guarantees of the various Scapulars.

To be protected by the Scapular, the Scapular must be worn at all times. No protection is afforded when the Scapular is not being worn.

The best known of the Scapulars is the Brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, but there are more Scapulars that can be worn. Here's a list:

So, what about the Scapular medal? Well

In 1910, Pope St. Pius X introduced a Scapular Medal which may be substituted in most cases for any of the various scapulars. **Valid enrollment in the (cloth) scapulars must, however, be made before the substitution.** The condition for this substitution is that this medal has an image of Our Most Holy Redeemer, Jesus Christ, showing His Sacred Heart, and the obverse that of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary.
