What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....?

Question:

So I a good friend heard on EWTN radio that Catholics should not get the shingles vaccine because it is made of fetal tissue from aborted fetus. Is that true?

My Answer:

Wow! Bioethics here we go. I took a bioethics class for the diaconate program, but we never talked about vaccines. So I've been reading.

I guess I didn't realize how many vaccines are derived from aborted fetal tissue. It is amazing to see that vaccines for Rubella, Shingles, Chickenpox and the like have their beginnings from these tissues. But that's not the whole story.

For Catholics and others by the way, it's not just Catholics, but we are the standard bearers when it comes to Pro-Life issues. But has anyone ever thought about vaccines?

Now I'm not the bio-expert here so if there are any who are, please be ready to respond.

The articles that I read explain that the vaccines presently used are from tissue of aborted fetus from around 1960. The line of viruses continue from that first tissue used. Thus the vaccines of today are about 40 plus years removed from the original act of abortion. So does that make it right or the better question is, should a Catholic be vaccinated since the line was started from an aborted fetus?

This has been addressed by the Vatican in an article written in answer to this very question. The article is entitled "MORAL REFLECTIONS ON VACCINES PREPARED FROM CELLS DERIVED FROM ABORTED HUMAN FOETUSES" from the PONTIFICIA ACADEMIA PRO VITA.

Basically the article boils down to those receiving the vaccine, let's say for shingles, are not morally culpable for the original immoral act of abortion that took place in the 1960's. However, a decision of this sort may cause a moral dilemma for the individual.

There are those who will say that any act of receiving a vaccine from any line of aborted tissue is immoral and thus if used is tantamount to being part and parcel to the Pro-Choice agenda. The article would clearly say that is not the case.

It really comes down to where you stand on health, vaccines, and bioethics. Clearly if you pronounce yourself Catholic you have chosen the side of Pro-Life and are clearly against abortion. But in this age of understanding bioethical issues we need to keep ourselves informed of these issues.

Again, please note that I am not a bioethicist. Did I spell that right?
