Question: The question is, "the Apostles Creed states that Jesus will come again to judge the living and the dead", so does Jesus judge the dead again at the Last Judgement? Do they get judged twice?

Answer: These words might suggest that at Jesus' second coming, the Parousia, the Last Judgement, that those who have already passed from this earthly realm will have a second judgement. That's what it sounds like.

In actuality the words "the living and the dead" refer to Jesus being the judge of all, that only Jesus does this by virtue of His death and resurrection and that we will all pass through His judgement.

The Church clearly states that there are definitely two judgements. The first of these being what is known as "the Particular Judgement". This particular judgement is each of our own judgements and occurs at the time of our death. When we die, we will be judged. We will be judged as to whether heaven or hell is to be our eternal resting place. That judgement stands and will not be overturned in the future. Thus where we are at the Last Judgement is where we will still be for all eternity, "for there is a great chasm for which no one will pass" (Luke 16:26.)

Jesus speaks clearly to this point when He says that we need to be prepared at all times for we will not know when our earthly life will end, this in particular because there is no second chance. We have made our decision and God upholds that decision.

The Church has forever warned of confessing Mortal Sin as soon as possible just for that case of an untimely death. We have gone away from this notion. There seems to be the Merciful God syndrome now days that God couldn't send us to hell because of His mercy. God's mercy is always before us, but we have free will and we can choose to not repent of our sin by turning to God for forgiveness. To say that God will take care of it without asking for God to take care of it is arrogance and actually to be God like or in other words, to be God.

Opps! That will get us to hell quicker than anything. God is God and we are God's creatures. We must turn towards God.

We have been given the great Sacrament of Reconciliation and if we don't avail ourselves of it, we are basically saying to God, I don't need

your forgiveness. That's the sin of pride, the greatest of the seven deadly sins.
