

Question: I was asked to explain in more detail the meaning of Adoration, Exposition and Benediction since we do all three at St. Catherine's and some at St. Charles and St. Louis.

Answer: There is a distinction among all three although all three are concerned with praise of Jesus Christ in His Person and the blessings that we receive from Jesus in our participation in them.

The first order of praise is Adoration. Adoration in its simplest form can take place within a church setting in front of a tabernacle, in which Jesus is present, while one kneels or sits in prayer and praise of Jesus. A typical thing to do is to make a Holy Hour or in other words spend an hour with Jesus. There are no particular prayers that need to be said, just spend time.

The second order of praise is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Exposition means exposing the Body of Christ for the faithful to witness Jesus face to face. With exposition comes special prayers with an opening and closing of exposition and possibly special prayers within the exposition time period. There is no set time of exposition, however, there is a requirement that someone be present at all times during exposition. There is a twofold reason for this. The first and most important is that Jesus is not left to Himself alone. This harkens back to the Agony in the Garden when Jesus asks His Disciples to spend an hour with him. The other reason is more practical oriented. We always safeguard Jesus so that no Disrespect Can Happen, thus we stay with Jesus at all times.

The third order of praise is the Liturgy of Benediction. Benediction basically means a blessing. In the case of this Liturgical celebration, those in attendance will receive a blessing coming directly from Jesus, not the celebrant. Typically at the end of a Mass we receive a blessing from the priest, but at a Benediction, if property done, we receive a blessing directly from Jesus Himself. You will see the celebrant wrap his hands in a Cope or Humeral Veil when he picks up the Monstrance, the Sacred Vessel holding the Body of Jesus, and makes the Sign of the Cross with the Body of Christ Jesus.

So I would say that the ultimate in Adoration is the Benediction, which incorporates all three of the afore mentioned modes of praise to Jesus the Christ.

I would invite you to come and partake of Adoration at St. Catherine's on Tuesday or Thursday evenings or on Monday mornings at St. Louis. The times are in the bulletin with Benediction occurring on First Tuesday of each month at St. Catherine's from 6:00 to 7:00 PM.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is a great way to develop a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ outside of Mass. It is a quiet time with Jesus, personal time with Jesus. It is a time for young and old alike. Growing up in a Catholic family at a time when Church meant more than Mass, I got to experience Jesus in a way that seems to have fallen by the wayside. These times are meant for our children too.

Advent is upon us, what a great way to get to know Jesus! Peace.

ADVENT STUDY/EPIPHANY MASS Did you know that the Traditional Latin Mass is making a comeback all over the country? There are over 500 parishes that offer the "Extraordinary Form" of the Mass regularly and many more that offer it occasionally. Are these Masses attended mainly by the older, sentimental people who remember the "Good Old Days." No. They are filled mainly with lots of young families and young adults who have discovered for the first time the liturgy and spirituality of the Latin Mass. Some of the questions we will explore are: Why Latin? Why the Latin Mass? Where are the similarities and differences in the Ordinary Form and the Extraordinary Form? What is the spirituality of the Latin Mass? Why do so many young people seek out a Latin Mass?

This will be our Advent study this year. We will meet in the parish hall of St. Catherine on Wednesday evenings from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. on December 2nd, 9th, 16th, and 23rd. This will be an introduction to the Latin Mass, some of the common Latin responses and some of the music associated with it. Music will be led by Dr. Leszek Fiutowski, who has had extensive training and

experience in Church Organ music, the Latin Mass and Gregorian Chant. (Some of the music, by the way, many of you already know).

We will also prepare everyone for participation in a Latin Mass on Epiphany, January 6, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. at St. Catherine. Everyone is welcome.
