

Question: So, finely a question. Is there a difference between soul and spirit and if so, what is it?

Answer: I looked for the answer several years ago when I was asked if dogs go to heaven by one of the women at FPC Alderson during our RCIA class. I answered very directly, NO, because dogs don't have a soul. Only humans have a soul. <u>I</u> was dead wrong on that one. All living creatures have a soul.

Let me explain. The soul is the animation of a body or in other words the movements, the responses to stimuli, etc. If not then the body just sits motionless. Kind of like a rock. A plant has soul since it responds to the environment and the stimuli that causes an effect within the body. Sun for instance stimulates the plant to do something. A dog or any animal the same way.

Now there is a difference in humans. Humans add the spiritual aspect to the soul. The spirit and soul are in a sense one with each other and one with God. The difference between human souls and all other souls is that outside of humans, all other living beings respond as they are created to respond, where humans can choose another path, a path against what is meant for the human - Free Will!!
