Some of the faithful are called to serve God's people in a more particular way through one of the many liturgical ministries that have flourished in the Church since the Second Vatican Council. This diversity of roles, functions and ministries enriches our celebrations and assists us in our prayer. Serving in one of these ministries is both an honor and a privilege.

As a member of the Body of Christ, you are encouraged to prayerfully discern if our God is calling you to the ministry of cantor. Guidance and support are provided.
