


The Catholic Response to the Tragic Earthquake in Nepal

The tragic earthquake in Nepal has killed thousands of people and caused an immense amount of destruction. As the people of the region start to try to rebuild their lives, they need the help and support of the world, and as Catholics we cannot ignore such suffering happening in our world. We might not be able to solve all the problems that a natural disaster of this scale is causing, but we do have to unite ourselves with Jesus as he grieves all the suffering that the evil of this earthquake has created. The first way that we do that is through prayer. We have a duty to ask for the strength, protection, guidance, and healing that the people of the region need. We also have to examine whether our resources allow us to give to the people who have lost so much. There are already a lot of organizations working and helping in the region, with Catholic Relief Services being involved in a big way, as they are in so many other crisis points.

To help all those who want to make a donation to help the people of Nepal, our parish will be participating in the archdiocesan special collection for the victims of the earthquake. Next week we will be having a special second collection for this very important cause. There are no envelopes for this collection, but I invite you to be generous in reaching out to those who need help so very badly. If you would like to contribute by check, please make it out to St. Thomas Aquinas Parish, and put "Nepal earthquake" in the "for" line of the check. We will be sending a single check, collecting all the donations for that collection, to the archdiocese to pass on to Catholic Charities as they respond to the needs on the ground.

I know that we as a community will respond in a great way to this crucial collection. Thank you all for your love and generosity toward those in need, something we see in so many places throughout the year. May the Lord reward each of you greatly for your willingness to give of yourselves to serve Jesus in the person of those who are most in need.

Also new this spring is the start of a 3-year lawn improvement project. During a project like this, we should expect things to look worse before they look better. Unfortunately, weeds are green while dead weeds and dirt are brown. Please pardon our appearance as we move through the necessary steps to establish a healthy new lawn.

With First Communions behind us and Confirmation happening at the end of the month, this year in he religious education program is slowly coming to an end. Looking back on our year we realize just how much we rely upon our many hard-working volunteers. We'd like to acknowledge our catechists who prepared weekly lessons and educated our children on our Catholic faith. We appreciate the flexibility of our substitutes and hall monitors who are ready to jump in and help with the many projects that come up.

New for us this year was the Children's Ministry at the 10:00 Mass for children ages 3-7. Our volunteers Charlene Freccero and Francine Littlejohn spearheaded this ministry using Pflaum's Gospel Weekly. Our music minister, Regina, led the children in song at the Liturgy of the Word when the children processed downstairs to learn about the Word of God using age appropriate materials.

The monthly Grade Level Liturgies continued this year with the helps of teachers who helped coordinate and organize each Mass. We'd like to recognize the following teachers: Julie Lynch (Gr 1), MaryEllen Wall (Gr 3), Liz Longo (Gr 4), Heather Breault (Gr 5), Beth Peterson (Gr 6), Kate Anderson (Gr 7) and Roberta Harvey (Gr 8). Thank you to the families who encouraged their children to participate as lectors, gift bearers and greeters.

Although we had some schedule interruptions due to snow, the majority of the children in our program attended a Teaching Mass at the church taught by either Fr. Bill or Fr. Adrian. Thank you to our priests for teaching the children about the beauty of the Mass. This is a great opportunity for our priests and children to come together outside the classroom.

Our Sacrament programs were as vibrant as ever. 108 Second Graders received both Sacraments of Penance and Eucharist this year. It's rewarding to watch everyone come together for this joyous celebration. Thank you to Lisa Folloni who helps us each year with rehearsals, parent meetings, and comes to each Mass to serve as Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. This year we were approached by Cathy Broderick who offered First Communion portraits, \$25 of which was donated to our parish. Parents appreciated the beautiful portraits and we are grateful to Cathy for her generosity.

Approximately 100 students will be confirmed by Bishop Dooher on May 31st. We had a successful year using the YouCat Confirmation curriculum. This was our first year using this curriculum and we hope our students came to a deeper understanding of Jesus' love for them. We supplemented the program with monthly guest speakers as well as an all day retreat conducted by the Capuchins. Within the next month we will be attending two all day workshops at the Pastoral Center. We hope to come back with more ideas as we try to improve our program each year. What is the ministry of cantor? All liturgical ministers are, first and foremost, members of the Body of Christ. Through their baptism they are the "holy people and royal priesthood" whose right and privilege it is to participate in the ministry of Christ. Since the celebration of the Eucharist is the "action of the whole Church" (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, Introduction #5), everyone in the assembly has "an individual right and duty to contribute their participation" (GIRM #58). Some of the faithful are called to serve God's people in a more particular way through one of the many liturgical ministries that have flourished in the Church since the Second Vatican Council. This diversity of roles, functions and ministries enriches our celebrations and assists us in our prayer. Serving in one of these ministries is both an honor and a privilege.

As a member of the Body of Christ, you are encouraged to prayerfully discern if our God is calling you to the ministry of cantor. Guidance and support are provided.
